1-10 relating to online institution resumes for public institutions of  
1-11 higher education.

1-12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-13 SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 3, Education Code, is amended  
1-14 by adding Chapter 51A to read as follows:

1-15 CHAPTER 51A. ONLINE INSTITUTION RESUMES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER  
1-16 EDUCATION

1-17 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1-18 Sec. 51A.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

1-19 (1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher  
1-20 Education Coordinating Board.

1-21 (2) "General academic teaching institution,"  
1-22 "institution of higher education," "medical and dental unit,"  
1-23 "public state college," and "public technical institute" have the  
1-24 meanings assigned by Section 61.003.

1-25 Sec. 51A.002. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COORDINATING BOARD  
1-26 RELATING TO INSTITUTION RESUMES; GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR  
1-27 INSTITUTION RESUMES. (a) The coordinating board, in consultation  
1-28 with each institution of higher education to which this chapter  
1-29 applies, shall develop and maintain online resumes for each of  
1-30 those institutions.

1-31 (b) The coordinating board shall:

1-32 (1) request from each institution of higher education  
1-33 to which this chapter applies any information the coordinating  
1-34 board considers necessary for the coordinating board to include  
1-35 information or calculate data required to be included in the  
1-36 institution's resume;

1-37 (2) establish for each institution of higher education  
1-38 to which this chapter applies a list of representative in-state and  
1-39 out-of-state peer institutions and maintain that list on the  
1-40 coordinating board's Internet website;

1-41 (3) ensure that each of an institution of higher  
1-42 education's online resumes:

1-43 (A) is available to the public on the  
1-44 coordinating board's Internet website, in a one-page format if  
1-45 possible, and is accessible through a link that appears in a  
1-46 prominent place on the coordinating board's Internet website home  
1-47 page;

1-48 (B) uses enhanced, user-friendly search  
1-49 capabilities to ensure that the information required to be included  
1-50 in the resume is easily accessible to the persons for whom the  
1-51 resume is designed; and

1-52 (C) includes a clearly identifiable link to  
1-53 information on the coordinating board's Internet website regarding  
1-54 the coordinating board's higher education accountability system;  
1-55 and

1-56 (4) ensure that the information provided in each  
1-57 resume is accurate and up to date and includes the most recent data  
1-58 available for out-of-state peer institutions.

1-59 (c) The coordinating board may modify, as the coordinating  
1-60 board considers necessary, national data regarding an  
1-61 institution's out-of-state peer institutions to ensure uniformity  
1-62 in the comparison of that data to data regarding the institution for  
1-63 which the resume is created and the institution's in-state peer

2-1 institutions in a resume under this chapter.

2-2 (d) The coordinating board is not required to include in the  
2-3 resume any category of information that is unavailable to the  
2-4 coordinating board.

2-5 Sec. 51A.003. DUTIES OF INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION  
2-6 RELATING TO INSTITUTION RESUMES. Each institution of higher  
2-7 education to which this chapter applies shall:

2-8 (1) submit to the coordinating board any information  
2-9 requested by the coordinating board as necessary for the  
2-10 coordinating board to include information or calculate data  
2-11 required to be included in the institution's resumes; and

2-12 (2) ensure that the institution's Internet website  
2-13 home page includes, in a prominent place, an accessible link to the  
2-14 institution's online resumes maintained on the coordinating board's  
2-15 Internet website.

2-17 SUBCHAPTER B. ONLINE INSTITUTION RESUMES FOR FOUR-YEAR GENERAL  
2-18 ACADEMIC TEACHING INSTITUTIONS

2-19 Sec. 51A.051. APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter  
2-20 applies only to general academic teaching institutions, other than  
2-21 public state colleges.

2-22 Sec. 51A.052. INSTITUTION RESUME FOR LEGISLATORS AND OTHER  
2-23 POLICY MAKERS. (a) The coordinating board shall maintain for each  
2-24 institution to which this subchapter applies an online resume that  
2-25 is designed for use by legislators and other interested policy  
2-26 makers.

2-27 (b) The resume required by this section must identify:

2-28 (1) the institutional grouping to which the  
2-29 institution is assigned under the coordinating board's higher  
2-30 education accountability system; and

2-31 (2) the institution's in-state and out-of-state peer  
2-32 institutions.

2-33 (c) For purposes of this section, information required to be

3-14 available to the institution in that state fiscal year.  
3-15 Sec. 51A.053. INSTITUTION RESUME FOR PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS,  
3-16 PARENTS, AND MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC. (a) The coordinating board  
3-17 shall maintain for each institution to which this subchapter  
3-18 applies an online resume that is designed for use by prospective  
3-19 students of the institution, their parents, and other interested  
3-20 members of the public. A resume required for an institution under  
3-21 this section is not required to include information that the  
3-22 coordinating board considers to be substantially duplicative of  
3-23 information reported and available to the public through the  
3-24 Voluntary System of Accountability Program.  
3-25 (b) The resume must identify:  
3-26 (1) the institutional grouping to which the  
3-27 institution is assigned under the coordinating board's higher  
3-28 education accountability system; and  
3-29 (2) the institution's in-state peer institutions.  
3-30 (c) Except as otherwise provided by the coordinating board  
3-31 under Subsection (a), the resume must include the following
