1-6 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
1-7 AN ACT

1-8 relating to providing training in personal financial literacy  
1-9 instruction for public school teachers.

1-10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-11 SECTION 1. Subsection (d), Section 8.051, Education Code,  
1-12 is amended to read as follows:

1-13 (d) Each regional education service center shall maintain  
1-14 core services for purchase by school districts and campuses. The  
1-15 core services are:

1-16 (1) training and assistance in:

1-17 (A) teaching each subject area assessed under  
1-18 Section 39.023; and

1-19 (B) providing instruction in personal financial  
1-20 literacy as required under Section 28.0021;

1-21 (2) training and assistance in providing each program  
1-22 that qualifies for a funding allotment under Section 42.151,  
1-23 42.152, 42.153, or 42.156;

1-24 (3) assistance specifically designed for a school  
1-25 district rated academically unacceptable under Section 39.072(a)  
1-26 or a campus whose performance is considered unacceptable based on  
1-27 the indicators adopted under Section 39.051;

1-28 (4) training and assistance to teachers,  
1-29 administrators, members of district boards of trustees, and members  
1-30 of site-based decision-making committees;

1-31 (5) assistance specifically designed for a school  
1-32 district that is considered out of compliance with state or federal  
1-33 special education requirements, based on the agency's most recent  
1-34 compliance review of the district's special education programs; and

1-35 (6) assistance in complying with state laws and rules.

1-36 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
1-37 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
1-38 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
1-39 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
1-40 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
