- 6 SECTION 1. Section 54.058(i), Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:

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- 8 (i) A former member of the Armed Forces of the United States
- 9 or the former member's spouse or dependent child is entitled to pay
- 10 the tuition fees and other fees or charges provided for Texas
- 11 residents for any term or semester at a state institution of higher
- 12 education [that begins before the first anniversary of the member's
- 13 separation from the Armed Forces] if the former member[+
- 14  $\left[\frac{(1)}{1}\right]$  has retired,  $\left[\frac{\partial r}{\partial r}\right]$  been honorably discharged or
- 15 separated, or received a general discharge under honorable
- 16 conditions from the Armed Forces[; and
- 17 [(2) has complied with the requirements of Subsection
- 18 <del>(d)</del>].
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 54.058(i), Education Code, as amended by
- 20 this Act, applies beginning with tuition and other fees charged for
- 21 the first term or semester that begins after the effective date of
- 22 this Act, but not earlier than the 2009 fall semester. Tuition and
- 23 other fees charged for an academic period before that term or
- 24 semester are covered by the law in effect immediately before the

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- 1 effective date of this  $\mathsf{Act}$ , and the former law is continued in
- 2 effect for that purpose.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
