A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the minimum salary schedule for certain public school 3 employees.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sections 12.133(b), (c), (d), and (e), Education 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:

(b) Each school year, using state funds received by the 7 charter holder for that purpose under Subsection (d), a charter 8 holder that participated in the program under Chapter 1579, 9 Insurance Code, for the 2005-2006 school year shall provide 10 employees of the charter holder, other than administrators, 11 12 compensation in the form of annual salaries, incentives, or other 13 compensation determined appropriate by the charter holder that 14 results in an average compensation increase for classroom teachers, full-time librarians, full-time counselors, <u>full-time speech</u> 15 language pathologists, full-time audiologists, and full-time 16 school nurses who are employed by the charter holder and who would 17 18 be entitled to a minimum salary under Section 21.402 if employed by a school district, in an amount at least equal to \$2,500. 19

(c) Each school year, using state funds received by the charter holder for that purpose under Subsection (e), a charter holder that did not participate in the program under Chapter 1579, Insurance Code, for the 2005-2006 school year shall provide employees of the charter holder, other than administrators,

compensation in the form of annual salaries, incentives, or other 1 2 compensation determined appropriate by the charter holder that 3 results in an average compensation increase for classroom teachers, 4 full-time librarians, full-time counselors, full-time speech 5 language pathologists, full-time audiologists, and full-time school nurses who are employed by the charter holder and who would 6 7 be entitled to a minimum salary under Section 21.402 if employed by 8 a school district, in an amount at least equal to \$2,000.

9 Each school year, in addition to any amounts to which a (d) charter holder is entitled under this chapter, a charter holder 10 that participated in the program under Chapter 1579, Insurance 11 Code, for the 2005-2006 school year is entitled to state aid in an 12 amount, as determined by the commissioner, equal to the product of 13 14 \$2,500 multiplied by the number of classroom teachers, full-time librarians, full-time counselors, <u>full-time speech language</u> 15 pathologists, full-time audiologists, and full-time school nurses 16 17 employed by the charter holder at an open-enrollment charter school. 18

Each school year, in addition to any amounts to which a 19 (e) charter holder is entitled under this chapter, a charter holder 20 that did not participate in the program under Chapter 1579, 21 Insurance Code, for the 2005-2006 school year is entitled to state 22 23 aid in an amount, as determined by the commissioner, equal to the 24 product of \$2,000 multiplied by the number of classroom teachers, 25 full-time librarians, full-time counselors, full-time speech 26 language pathologists, full-time audiologists, and full-time school nurses employed by the charter holder at an open-enrollment 27

1 charter school.

2 SECTION 2. Section 19.007(f), Education Code, is amended to 3 read as follows:

4 (f) In addition to other amounts received by the district under this section, the district is entitled to state aid in an 5 6 amount equal to the product of \$2,000 multiplied by the number of 7 classroom teachers, full-time librarians, full-time counselors 8 certified under Subchapter B, Chapter 21, full-time speech language 9 pathologists, full-time audiologists, and full-time school nurses who are employed by the district and who would be entitled to a 10 minimum salary under Section 21.402 if employed by a school 11 district operating under Chapter 11. 12

SECTION 3. Section 19.009(d-1), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

15 (d-1) Each school year, the district shall pay an amount at least equal to \$2,000 to each classroom teacher, full-time 16 17 librarian, full-time counselor certified under Subchapter B, Chapter 21, full-time speech language pathologist, full-time 18 audiologist, and full-time school nurse who is employed by the 19 district and who would be entitled to a minimum salary under Section 20 21.402 if employed by a school district operating under Chapter 11. 21 A payment under this section is in addition to wages the district 22 23 would otherwise pay the employee during the school year.

24 SECTION 4. Sections 21.402(a) and (g), Education Code, are 25 amended to read as follows:

26 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (d), (e), or (f), a
27 school district must pay each classroom teacher, full-time

1 librarian, full-time counselor certified under Subchapter B, 2 <u>full-time speech language pathologist, full-time audiologist,</u> or 3 full-time school nurse not less than the minimum monthly salary, 4 based on the employee's level of experience in addition to other 5 factors, as determined by commissioner rule, determined by the 6 following formula:

 $MS = SF \times FS$

8 where:

9

"MS" is the minimum monthly salary;

10 "SF" is the applicable salary factor specified by Subsection
11 (c); and

"FS" is the amount, as determined by the commissioner under 12 Subsection (b), of state and local funds per weighted student, 13 14 including funds provided under Section 42.2516(b)(1)(B), but not 15 funds provided under Section 42.2516(b)(1)(A), (b)(1)(C), (b)(2), or (b)(3), available to a district eligible to receive state 16 17 assistance under Section 42.302 with a maintenance and operations tax rate per \$100 of taxable value equal to the product of the state 18 compression percentage, as determined under Section 42.2516, 19 multiplied by \$1.50, except that the amount of state and local funds 20 per weighted student does not include the amount attributable to 21 the increase in the guaranteed level made by Chapter 1187 (H.B. 22 3343), Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001. 23

24 (g) The commissioner may adopt rules to govern the 25 application of this section, including rules that:

(1) require the payment of a minimum salary under thissection to a person employed in more than one capacity for which a

1 minimum salary is provided and whose combined employment in those
2 capacities constitutes full-time employment; and

3 (2) specify the credentials a person must hold to be
4 considered a school nurse, speech language pathologist, or
5 <u>audiologist</u> under this section.

6 SECTION 5. Sections 21.403(a) and (c), Education Code, are 7 amended to read as follows:

8 (a) A teacher, librarian, counselor, <u>speech language</u> 9 <u>pathologist, audiologist,</u> or nurse shall advance one step on the 10 minimum salary schedule under Section 21.402 for each year of 11 experience as a teacher, librarian, counselor, <u>speech language</u> 12 <u>pathologist, audiologist,</u> or nurse until step 20 is reached.

(c) The commissioner shall adopt rules for determining the 13 experience for which a teacher, librarian, counselor, speech 14 15 language pathologist, audiologist, or nurse is to be given credit in placing the teacher, librarian, counselor, speech language 16 17 pathologist, audiologist, or nurse on the minimum salary schedule. A district shall credit the teacher, librarian, counselor, speech 18 language pathologist, audiologist, or nurse for each year of 19 experience without regard to whether the years are consecutive. 20

21 SECTION 6. Section 30.102(b), Education Code, is amended to 22 read as follows:

(b) A classroom teacher, full-time librarian, full-time
counselor certified under Subchapter B, Chapter 21, <u>full-time</u>
<u>speech language pathologist, full-time audiologist,</u> or full-time
school nurse employed by the commission is entitled to receive as a
minimum salary the monthly salary specified by Section 21.402. A

classroom teacher, full-time librarian, full-time counselor, <u>full-time speech language pathologist, full-time audiologist,</u> or full-time school nurse may be paid, from funds appropriated to the commission, a salary in excess of the minimum specified by that section, but the salary may not exceed the rate of pay for a similar position in the public schools of an adjacent school district.

7 SECTION 7. Section 42.2512(a), Education Code, is amended 8 to read as follows:

9 (a) A school district, including a school district that is 10 otherwise ineligible for state aid under this chapter, is entitled 11 to state aid in an amount, as determined by the commissioner, equal 12 to the difference, if any, between:

amount equal to the product of 13 (1)an \$3,000 14 multiplied by the number of classroom teachers, full-time 15 librarians, full-time counselors certified under Subchapter B, Chapter 21, full-time speech language pathologists, full-time 16 17 audiologists, and full-time school nurses employed by the district and entitled to a minimum salary under Section 21.402; and 18

(2) an amount equal to 80 percent of the amount of
additional funds to which the district is entitled due to the
increases made by <u>Chapter 396 (S.B. 4)</u> [S.B. No. 4], Acts of the
76th Legislature, Regular Session, 1999, to:

23 (A) the equalized wealth level under Section 24 41.002;

(B) the basic allotment under Section 42.101; and
 (C) the guaranteed level of state and local funds
 per weighted student per cent of tax effort under Section 42.302.

S.B. No. 209 S.B. No. 209 SECTION 8. Section 42.2516(b), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

3 (b) Subject to Subsections (b-1), (b-2), (f-1), (g), and 4 (h), but notwithstanding any other provision of this title, a 5 school district is entitled to state revenue necessary to provide 6 the district with the sum of:

7 (1) the amount of state revenue necessary to maintain
8 state and local revenue per student in weighted average daily
9 attendance in the amount equal to the greater of:

10 (A) the amount of state and local revenue per 11 student in weighted average daily attendance for the maintenance 12 and operations of the district available to the district for the 13 2005-2006 school year;

(B) the amount of state and local revenue per 14 15 student in weighted average daily attendance for the maintenance and operations of the district to which the district would have been 16 entitled for the 2006-2007 school year under this chapter, as it 17 existed on January 1, 2006, or, if the district would have been 18 subject to Chapter 41, as that chapter existed on January 1, 2006, 19 the amount to which the district would have been entitled under that 20 chapter, based on the funding elements in effect for the 2005-2006 21 school year, if the district imposed a maintenance and operations 22 tax at the rate adopted by the district for the 2005 tax year; or 23

(C) the amount of state and local revenue per student in weighted average daily attendance for the maintenance and operations of the district to which the district would have been entitled for the 2006-2007 school year under this chapter, as it

existed on January 1, 2006, or, if the district would have been subject to Chapter 41, as that chapter existed on January 1, 2006, the amount to which the district would have been entitled under that chapter, based on the funding elements in effect for the 2005-2006 school year, if the district imposed a maintenance and operations tax at the rate equal to the rate described by Section 26.08(i) or (k)(1), Tax Code, as applicable, for the 2006 tax year;

8 (2) an amount equal to the product of \$2,500 9 multiplied by the number of classroom teachers, full-time librarians, full-time counselors certified under Subchapter B, 10 Chapter 21, full-time speech language pathologists, full-time 11 audiologists, and full-time school nurses employed by the district 12 and entitled to a minimum salary under Section 21.402; and 13

14 (3) an amount equal to the product of \$275 multiplied
15 by the number of students in average daily attendance in grades nine
16 through 12 in the district.

SECTION 9. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010school year.

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SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
