## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the sale or delivery of salvia divinorum or Salvinorin A
- 3 to a child; providing a penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 48, Penal Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Section 48.03 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 48.03. PROHIBITION RELATING TO SALE OR DELIVERY OF
- 8 SALVIA DIVINORUM TO CHILD. (a) In this section, "child" means a
- 9 person younger than 18 years of age.
- 10 (b) A person commits an offense if the person, with criminal
- 11 <u>negligence</u>, sells, delivers, or causes to be sold or delivered
- 12 <u>salvia divinorum, Salvinorin A, or a product containing salvia</u>
- 13 divinorum or Salvinorin A to a child or to another person who
- 14 intends to deliver it to a child.
- 15 (c) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
- 16 (d) It is not a defense to prosecution under this section
- 17 that, at the time of the offense, the actor was an employee of a
- 18 retail establishment that sold or offered for sale salvia
- 19 divinorum, Salvinorin A, or a product containing salvia divinorum
- 20 or Salvinorin A.
- 21 (e) It is a defense to prosecution under this section that
- 22 the child presented to the actor an apparently valid proof of
- 23 identification, including a driver's license issued by this state
- 24 or another state, a passport, or an identification certificate or

- 1 card issued by a state or the federal government. A proof of
- 2 <u>identification</u> satisfies the requirements of this subsection if the
- 3 identification:
- 4 (1) contains a physical description and photograph
- 5 consistent with the person's appearance;
- 6 (2) purports to establish that the person is 18 years
- 7 of age or older; and
- 8 (3) was issued by a governmental agency.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
