- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 2251, Insurance Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 2251.1511 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 2251.1511. PRIOR APPROVAL FOR CERTAIN RESIDENTIAL
- 8 PROPERTY INSURANCE RATES. (a) An insurer may not use a rate for
- 9 residential property insurance until the rate and all other
- 10 <u>information required by Section 2251.101 have been filed with the</u>
- department and the rate has been approved by the commissioner if the
- 12 insurer, together with any of the insurer's affiliates and
- 13 subsidiaries, as those terms are defined by Section 823.003, issued
- 14 property and casualty insurance policies in this state that
- accounted for at least five percent of the total amount of premiums
- 16 collected by insurers for property and casualty insurance in this
- 17 state in the calendar year preceding the date the filing is
- 18 required or the rate is otherwise proposed to be used.
- (b) Sections 2251.151(b) and (d) apply to rates filed under
- 20 this section.
- 21 (c) Section 2251.152 does not apply to rates for which prior
- 22 approval is required by this section.
- 23 SECTION 2. Section 2251.156(a), Insurance Code, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:

- 1 (a) If the commissioner disapproves a rate filing under 2 Section 2251.153(a)(2) or Section 2251.1511, the commissioner
- 3 shall issue an order disapproving the filing in accordance with
- 4 Section 2251.103(b).
- 5 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 6 to rates for residential property insurance that is delivered,
- 7 issued for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2010. Rates
- 8 for residential property insurance delivered, issued for delivery,
- 9 or renewed before January 1, 2010, are governed by the law as it
- 10 existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that
- 11 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
