## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the review of information technology systems used by a
3	state agency for compatibility with open standards.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 441.203, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsection (m) to read as follows:
7	(m) The council, in cooperation with the Department of
8	<pre>Information Resources, shall:</pre>
9	(1) review each state agency's existing information
10	technology system to determine whether the system is compatible
11	with open standards; and
12	(2) consult with and provide assistance to state
13	agencies on:
14	(A) enhancing the state agency's information
15	technology system to achieve compatibility with open standards
16	where appropriate; and
17	(B) identifying and recommending information
18	technology systems that are compatible with open standards and
19	recognized best practices, including:
20	(i) open standards for document formats for
21	creating, exchanging, and maintaining electronic texts,
22	presentations, and spreadsheets, to replace outdated systems that
23	are to be retired or upgraded;
24	(ii) open standards for database systems

based on the Structured Query Language (SQL) standard defined by 1 the American National Standards Institute (ANSI), to replace 2 3 outdated systems based on nonrelational database technologies that 4 are to be retired or upgraded; 5 (iii) recognized best practices for the structuring of data held in databases or disk file systems used by 6 7 mission-critical transaction processing applications, such that the data is held in normalized relational data tables, to replace 8 9 outdated methods of data organization based on nonrelational or highly nonnormalized data models, other than data warehouses and 10 11 business intelligence applications, that are to be retired or 12 upgraded; 13 (iv) open standards for programming languages used for the development and maintenance of 14 applications, such that the programming languages used shall 15 conform to standards recognized by national or international 16 standards bodies, to replace applications developed in outdated 17 programming languages that are to be retired or upgraded; and 18 (v) open standards for operating system 19 20 hardware interface layers, such that operating systems used in mission-critical applications are not tied exclusively to a single 21 brand of computer hardware or to a single type of microprocessor, to 22 replace outdated systems that are to be retired or updated. 23 24 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25

provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
