- 11 (b) The department may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and
- 12 donations from any public or private source for the purposes of this
- 13 <u>section</u>.
- 14 <u>(c) The department may adopt rules as necessary to</u>
- 15 administer an outreach program established under this section.
- 16 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is
- 17 amended by adding Section 38.026 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 38.026. GRANT PROGRAM FOR BEST PRACTICES IN NUTRITION
- 19 EDUCATION. (a) The Department of Agriculture shall develop a
- 20 program under which the department awards grants to public school
- 21 campuses for best practices in nutrition education.
- (b) The Department of Agriculture may solicit and accept
- 23 gifts, grants, and donations from any public or private source for
- 24 the purposes of this section.

- 1 (c) The Department of Agriculture may adopt rules as
- 2 necessary to administer a grant program established under this
- 3 section.
- 4 SECTION 3. Chapter 33, Human Resources Code, is amended by
- 5 adding Section 33.028 to read as follows:
- 6 <u>Sec. 33.028. GRANT PROGRAMS</u> FOR NUTRITION EDUCATION.
- 7 (a) The Department of Agriculture shall develop a program under
- 8 which the department awards grants to:
- 9 <u>(1) participants in the Child and Adult Care Food</u>
- 10 Program, Head Start program, or other early childhood education
- 11 programs to operate nutrition education programs for children who
- 12 are at least three years of age but younger than five years of age;
- 13 and
- 14 (2) community and faith-based initiatives that
- 15 provide recreational, social, volunteer, leadership, mentoring, or
- 16 <u>developmental programs to incorporate nutrition education into</u>
- 17 programs provided for children younger than 19 years of age.
- 18 (b) The Department of Agriculture may solicit and accept
- 19 gifts, grants, and donations from any public or private source for
- 20 the purposes of this section.
- 21 (c) The Department of Agriculture may adopt rules as
- 22 necessary to administer the grant programs established under this
- 23 section.
- SECTION 4. (a) This Act does not make an appropriation. A
- 25 provision in this Act that creates a new governmental program,
- 26 creates a new entitlement, or imposes a new duty on a governmental
- 27 entity is not mandatory during a fiscal period for which the

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- 1 legislature has not made a specific appropriation to implement the
- 2 provision.
- 3 (b) It is the intent of the legislature that not more than \$4
- 4 million may be appropriated for the implementation of this Act for
- 5 the state fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2009.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
