## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to resident tuition rates at public institutions of higher
3	education for certain veterans and their spouses and children.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 54.058, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsections (k) and (l) to read as follows:
7	(k) A person is entitled to pay tuition and fees at an
8	institution of higher education at the rates provided for Texas
9	residents without regard to the length of time the person has
10	resided in this state if the person files with the institution at

12 <u>residence in this state and resides in this state while enrolled in</u>

which the person intends to register a letter of intent to establish

- 13 the institution and the person:
- 14 <u>(1) is eligible for benefits under the federal</u>
- 15 Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 2008 (38 U.S.C.
- 16 Section 3301 et seq.) or any other federal law authorizing
- 17 educational benefits for veterans;
- 18 (2) is the spouse of a person described by Subdivision
- 19 <u>(1); or</u>

- 20 (3) is a child of a person described by Subdivision (1)
- 21 who is 25 years of age or younger on the first day of the semester or
- 22 other academic term for which the person is registering, except
- 23 that the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board by rule shall
- 24 prescribe procedures by which a person who suffered from a severe

- 1 illness or other debilitating condition that affected the person's
- 2 ability to use the benefit provided by this subsection before
- 3 reaching that age may be granted additional time to use the benefit
- 4 corresponding to the time the person was unable to use the benefit
- 5 because of the illness or condition.
- 6 (1) In this section, "child" includes a stepchild.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 54.058(k), Education Code, as added by
- 8 this Act, applies beginning with tuition and other fees charged for
- 9 the 2009 fall semester. Tuition and other fees charged for an
- 10 academic period before that term or semester are covered by the law
- in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the
- 12 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 13 SECTION 3. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- shall adopt the rules required by Section 54.058(k)(3), Education
- 15 Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after this Act
- 16 takes effect. For that purpose, the coordinating board may adopt
- 17 the initial rules in the manner provided by law for emergency rules.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
