A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
2	relating to the use of technology by public schools.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 32.005, Education Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 32.005. TECHNOLOGY ALLOTMENT. (a) Each school
7	district or open-enrollment charter school is entitled to an
8	allotment of $\frac{$100}{}$ [$\frac{$30}{}$] for each student in average daily
9	attendance or a <u>greater</u> [different] amount for any year provided by
10	appropriation.
11	(a-2) Subsection (a) applies beginning with the 2011-2012
12	school year. For the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 school years, a school
13	district or open-enrollment charter school is entitled to an
14	allotment in the following amount, or a greater amount for any year
15	provided by appropriation:
16	(1) for the 2009-2010 school year, \$50; and
17	(2) for the 2010-2011 school year, \$75.
18	(a-3) Subsection (a-2) and this subsection expire September
19	<u>1, 2011.</u>
20	(b) An allotment under this section may be used only to:

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open-enrollment charter schools of electronic textbooks or

technological equipment that contributes to student learning; and

(1) provide for the purchase by school districts or

(2) pay for training educational personnel directly

- 1 involved in student learning in the appropriate use of electronic
- 2 textbooks and for providing for access to technological equipment
- 3 for instructional use.
- 4 (b-1) A school district's or open-enrollment charter
- 5 school's allotment under this section must be used in accordance
- 6 with the district's or school's long-range technology plan filed
- 7 with the agency. The plan must demonstrate how money from the
- 8 allotment will be used to address specific outcomes at the school,
- 9 classroom, and teacher or student levels, including:
- 10 (1) any effect on the academic progress of students,
- 11 as measured by performance on assessment instruments, including
- 12 assessment instruments administered under Section 39.023;
- 13 (2) any elements that contribute to improved student
- 14 performance on assessment instruments administered under Section
- 15 39.023 or other assessment instruments required by the
- 16 commissioner;
- 17 (3) any cost savings or improved efficiency relating
- 18 to school personnel or the maintenance of school facilities;
- 19 <u>(4)</u> any effect on student attendance or dropout rates;
- 20 (5) any effect on student enrollment in higher
- 21 <u>education;</u>
- 22 (6) any effect on teacher performance or retention;
- 23 (7) any improvement in communications among students,
- 24 parents, teachers, and administrators;
- 25 (8) any improvement in parental involvement in the
- 26 education of the parent's child;
- 27 (9) any effect on community involvement and support

- for the district or school; and
- 2 (10) any increase in student proficiency in technology
- 3 that will help prepare students for becoming members of the
- 4 workforce.
- 5 (b-2) The agency shall evaluate available technological
- 6 solutions to determine whether any of the technological solutions
- 7 evaluated may be used in compliance with Subsections (b) and (b-1).
- 8 The agency shall:
- 9 (1) publish a list of technological solutions
- 10 evaluated that may be used in compliance with Subsections (b) and
- 11 (b-1); and
- 12 (2) update the list each calendar quarter.
- 13 (c) The allotment under this section may be paid from:
- 14 (1) the available school fund; or
- 15 (2) any other fund that may be used for that purpose
- 16 and that is identified in the General Appropriations Act as the
- 17 source of payment of the allotment, to the extent that the amount
- 18 appropriated from the available school fund is not sufficient to
- 19 fully fund the allotment.
- SECTION 2. Sections 32.151 and 32.152, Education Code, are
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 32.151. ESTABLISHMENT OF PILOT PROJECT. The agency
- 23 may by rule establish the technology immersion pilot project [to
- 24 provide a wireless mobile computing device to each student] in [a]
- 25 participating schools [school and implement the use of software,
- 26 on-line courses, and other appropriate learning technologies that
- 27 have been shown] to improve academic achievement and the progress

- 1 measures listed in Section 32.155(e).
- 2 Sec. 32.152. PILOT PROJECT ADMINISTRATION. The [If the
- 3 agency establishes the pilot project under Section 32.151, the]
- 4 agency shall establish a procedure and develop criteria for the
- 5 administration of the pilot project. In administering the pilot
- 6 project, the agency shall:
- 7 (1) select participating [school districts or]
- 8 schools;
- 9 (2) define the conditions for the distribution and use
- 10 of computer equipment and other technologies;
- 11 (3) purchase and distribute computer equipment and
- 12 other technologies;
- 13 (4) enter into contracts as necessary to implement the
- 14 pilot project;
- 15 (5) monitor local pilot project implementation; and
- 16 (6) conduct a final evaluation of the pilot project.
- SECTION 3. Section 32.153, Education Code, is amended by
- amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (d) to read
- 19 as follows:
- 20 (a) To implement the pilot project, the agency may use any
- 21 gift, grant, or donation given for the pilot project. The agency
- 22 may solicit and accept a gift, grant, or donation of any kind from
- 23 any source, including from a foundation, private entity,
- 24 governmental entity, and institution of higher education, for the
- 25 implementation of the pilot project. The agency may use [only
- 26 undedicated and unobligated] money from the general revenue fund
- 27 for purposes of the pilot project.

- 1 (c) <u>Subject to Subsection (d), the</u> [The] agency shall use
- pilot project funds for:
- 3 (1) the purchase of wireless mobile computing devices
- 4 so that each student in a participating classroom has a wireless
- 5 mobile computing device for use at school and at home;
- 6 (2) the purchase of other equipment, including
- 7 additional computer hardware and software;
- 8 (3) the hiring of technical support staff for school
- 9 districts or schools participating in the pilot project; and
- 10 (4) the purchase of technology-based learning
- 11 materials and resources.
- 12 (d) In using the available pilot project funds for schools
- 13 <u>selected under Section 32.154(a-1)(2) to participate in the pilot</u>
- 14 project, the agency:
- 15 (1) shall provide each school with an equal amount of
- 16 <u>funding;</u>
- 17 (2) may permit the funds to be used for any purpose
- 18 authorized by Subsection (c); and
- 19 (3) is not required to provide for the purchase of
- wireless mobile computing devices as provided by Subsection (c)(1).
- 21 SECTION 4. The heading to Section 32.154, Education Code,
- 22 is amended to read as follows:
- 23 Sec. 32.154. [DISTRICT OR] SCHOOL SELECTION.
- SECTION 5. Section 32.154, Education Code, is amended by
- 25 adding Subsection (a-1) and amending Subsection (b) to read as
- 26 follows:
- 27 (a-1) In addition to school districts and schools selected

- 1 before September 1, 2009, for participation in the technology
- 2 immersion pilot project, the agency shall select for participation
- 3 <u>in the pilot project for the 2009-2010 and subsequent school years:</u>
- 4 (1) each high school to which a district regularly
- 5 assigns students who were enrolled in grade eight during the
- 6 2008-2009 school year at a district school participating in the
- 7 pilot project; and
- 8 (2) one middle or junior high school in each state
- 9 senatorial district in which no school participated in the pilot
- 10 project for the 2008-2009 school year, to the extent funding is
- 11 available for that participation after providing funding to high
- 12 schools described by Subdivision (1).
- 13 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (a-1)(1), the [The]
- 14 agency shall select the participating [districts and] schools for
- 15 the pilot project based on each [district's or] school's need for
- 16 the pilot project. In selecting participants, the agency shall
- 17 consider the following criteria:
- 18 (1) whether the [district or] school has limited
- 19 access to educational resources that could be improved through the
- 20 use of electronic textbooks or technological equipment that
- 21 contributes to student learning [wireless mobile computing devices
- 22 and other technologies];
- 23 (2) whether the [district or] school has the following
- 24 problems and whether those problems can be mitigated through the
- 25 use of electronic textbooks or technological equipment that
- 26 contributes to student learning [wireless mobile computing devices
- 27 and other technologies]:

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- 1 (A) documented teacher shortages in critical
- 2 areas;
- 3 (B) limited access to advanced placement
- 4 courses;
- 5 (C) low rates of satisfactory performance on
- 6 assessment instruments under Subchapter B, Chapter 39; and
- 7 (D) high dropout rates;
- 8 (3) the [district's or] school's readiness to
- 9 incorporate technology into its classrooms;
- 10 (4) the possibility of obtaining a trained technology
- 11 support staff and high-speed Internet services for the [district
- 12 or school; and
- 13 (5) the methods the [district or] school will use to
- 14 measure the progress of the pilot project in the [district or]
- 15 school in accordance with Section 32.155(e).
- SECTION 6. Sections 32.154(a) and (c), Education Code, are
- 17 repealed.
- 18 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
