A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the tuition rebate program for certain undergraduate 3 students at general academic teaching institutions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Section 54.0065, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (b-1), (b-2), (j), and (k) to read as follows:
- 8 (b) Except as provided by Subsections (b-1) and (b-2), the
 9 [The] amount of tuition to be rebated to a student graduating in an
 10 academic year [under this section] is the amount certified for that
 11 academic year to the governing board of the general academic
 12 teaching institution by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating
 13 Board under this section.
- 14 (b-1) The amount of tuition to be rebated to a student is two
 15 times the certified amount if the student satisfies the
 16 requirements of this section in three years or less.
- (b-2) If [\$1,000, unless] the total amount of undergraduate 17 18 tuition paid by the student to the general academic teaching institution [of higher education] awarding the degree was less than 19 the full amount of rebate under Subsection (b) or (b-1), as 20 21 applicable [\$1,000], [in which event] the amount of tuition to be rebated is an amount equal to the amount of undergraduate tuition 22 paid by the student to the institution. However, the $[\frac{a}{a}]$ student 23 [who paid the institution awarding the degree an amount 24

undergraduate tuition less than \$1,000] may qualify for an increase in the amount of the rebate, not to exceed the applicable amount under Subsection (b) or (b-1) [a total rebate of \$1,000], for any amount of undergraduate tuition the student paid to other institutions of higher education by providing the institution with proof of the total amount of that tuition paid to other institutions of higher education.

- (j) Not later than August 15 of each academic year, the coordinating board shall determine and certify to the governing board of each general academic teaching institution the amount of tuition to be rebated by institutions under Subsection (b) to students graduating in the next academic year. The amount certified must equal the rebate amount certified in the preceding academic year to general academic teaching institutions under this subsection for rebates awarded under Subsection (b) in the current academic year, increased by a percentage, expressed in decimal form rounded to the nearest hundredth, that equals the average percentage by which those institutions have increased from the current academic year to the next academic year the total amount of tuition charged under Section 54.0513 or another law authorizing the institutions to establish tuition rates.
- (k) Notwithstanding Subsection (j), not later than October 31, 2009, the coordinating board shall determine and certify to the governing board of each general academic teaching institution the amount of tuition to be rebated by institutions under Subsection (b) to students graduating in the 2009-2010 academic year. The amount certified must equal the full amount of a rebate authorized

- to be awarded by general academic teaching institutions under 1 2 Subsection (b), as that subsection existed on January 1, 2009, during the 2008-2009 academic year, increased by a percentage, 3 4 expressed in decimal form rounded to the nearest hundredth, that equals the average percentage by which those institutions have 5 6 increased from the 2003-2004 academic year to the 2009-2010 7 academic year the total amount of tuition charged under Section 54.0513 or another law authorizing the institutions to establish 8 tuition rates. For purposes of Subsection (j), the amount 9 certified under this subsection is considered to have been 10 certified under Subsection (j) on August 15, 2009. This subsection 11 12 expires January 1, 2011.
- SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies only to a student who is awarded a baccalaureate degree from a general academic teaching institution on or after September 1, 2009.
- 17 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board may adopt 18 rules under Section 54.0065, Education Code, as amended by this 19 Act, for rebates awarded during the 2009-2010 academic year in the 20 manner provided by law for the adoption of emergency rules.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
