## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the civil and criminal consequences of operating a
3	motor vehicle or a watercraft while intoxicated or under the
4	influence of alcohol.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. The heading to Section 106.041, Alcoholic
7	Beverage Code, is amended to read as follows:
8	Sec. 106.041. DRIVING <u>OR OPERATING WATERCRAFT</u> UNDER THE
9	INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL BY MINOR.
10	SECTION 2. Subsections (a) and (g), Section 106.041,
11	Alcoholic Beverage Code, are amended to read as follows:
12	(a) A minor commits an offense if the minor operates a motor
13	vehicle in a public place, or a watercraft, while having any
14	detectable amount of alcohol in the minor's system.
15	(g) An offense under this section is not a lesser included
16	offense under Section 49.04, <u>49.045, or 49.06,</u> Penal Code.
17	SECTION 3. Subsection (j), Section 106.041, Alcoholic
18	Beverage Code, is amended by adding Subdivision (4) to read as
19	follows:
20	(4) "Watercraft" has the meaning assigned by Section
21	49.01, Penal Code.
22	SECTION 4. Subdivision (3), Section 524.001,
23	Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:
24	(3) "Alcohol-related or drug-related enforcement

No. 328 contact" means a driver's license suspension, disqualification, or 1 2 prohibition order under the laws of this state or another state resulting from: 3 a conviction of an offense prohibiting the 4 (A) operation of a motor vehicle or watercraft while: 5 (i) intoxicated; 6 7 (ii) under the influence of alcohol; or (iii) under the influence of a controlled 8 9 substance; 10 (B) a refusal to submit to the taking of a breath 11 or blood specimen following an arrest for an offense prohibiting the operation of a motor vehicle or an offense prohibiting the 12 13 operation of a watercraft, if the watercraft was powered with an engine having a manufacturer's rating of 50 horsepower or more, 14 15 while: 16 (i) intoxicated; 17 (ii) under the influence of alcohol; or 18 (iii) under the influence of a controlled 19 substance; or an analysis of a breath or blood specimen 20 (C) showing an alcohol concentration of a level specified by Section 21 22 49.01, Penal Code, following an arrest for an offense prohibiting the operation of a motor vehicle or watercraft while intoxicated. 23 SECTION 5. Subsection (a), Section 524.011, Transportation 24 25 Code, is amended to read as follows: 26 (a) An officer arresting a person shall comply with 27 Subsection (b) if:

1 (1) the person is arrested for an offense under Section 49.04, 49.045, or 49.06, Penal Code, or an offense under 2 Section 49.07 or 49.08 of that code involving the operation of a 3 4 motor vehicle or watercraft, submits to the taking of a specimen of breath or blood and an analysis of the specimen shows the person had 5 alcohol concentration of a level specified by 6 an Section 7 49.01(2)(B), Penal Code; or

8 (2) the person is a minor arrested for an offense under 9 Section 106.041, Alcoholic Beverage Code, or Section 49.04, <u>49.045</u>, 10 <u>or 49.06</u>, Penal Code, or an offense under Section 49.07 or 49.08, 11 Penal Code, involving the operation of a motor vehicle <u>or</u> 12 <u>watercraft</u> and:

13 (A) the minor is not requested to submit to the14 taking of a specimen; or

(B) the minor submits to the taking of a specimen and an analysis of the specimen shows that the minor had an alcohol concentration of greater than .00 but less than the level specified by Section 49.01(2)(B), Penal Code.

SECTION 6. Subsection (b), Section 524.012, Transportation
Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) The department shall suspend the person's driver'slicense if the department determines that:

(1) the person had an alcohol concentration of a level
specified by Section 49.01(2)(B), Penal Code, while operating a
motor vehicle in a public place <u>or while operating a watercraft</u>; or
(2) the person <u>was</u> [is] a minor <u>on the date that the</u>
breath or blood specimen was obtained and had any detectable amount

of alcohol in the minor's system while operating a motor vehicle in
 a public place or while operating a watercraft.

3 SECTION 7. Subsection (b), Section 524.015, Transportation
4 Code, is amended to read as follows:

5 A suspension may not be imposed under this chapter on a (b) person who is acquitted of a criminal charge under Section 49.04, 6 7 49.045, 49.06, 49.07, or 49.08, Penal Code, or Section 106.041, Alcoholic Beverage Code, arising from the occurrence that was the 8 9 basis for the suspension. If a suspension was imposed before the acquittal, the department shall rescind the suspension and shall 10 11 remove any reference to the suspension from the person's 12 computerized driving record.

SECTION 8. Subsection (b), Section 524.022, Transportation
Code, is amended to read as follows:

15 (b) A period of suspension under this chapter for a minor16 is:

(1) 60 days if the minor has not been previously convicted of an offense under Section 106.041, Alcoholic Beverage Code, or Section 49.04, 49.045, or 49.06, Penal Code, or an offense under Section 49.07 or 49.08, Penal Code, involving the operation of a motor vehicle <u>or a watercraft</u>;

(2) 120 days if the minor has been previouslyconvicted once of an offense listed by Subdivision (1); or

(3) 180 days if the minor has been previously
convicted twice or more of an offense listed by Subdivision (1).

26 SECTION 9. Section 524.023, Transportation Code, is amended 27 to read as follows:

1 Sec. 524.023. APPLICATION OF SUSPENSION UNDER OTHER LAWS. 2 (a) If a person is convicted of an offense under Section 106.041, Alcoholic Beverage Code, or Section 49.04, 49.045, 49.06, 49.07, or 3 4 49.08, Penal Code, and if any conduct on which that conviction is based is a ground for a driver's license suspension under this 5 chapter and Section 106.041, Alcoholic Beverage Code, Subchapter O, 6 7 Chapter 521, or Subchapter H, Chapter 522, each of the suspensions shall be imposed. 8

9 (b) The court imposing a driver's license suspension under Section 106.041, Alcoholic Beverage Code, or Chapter 521 or 522 as 10 11 required by Subsection (a) shall credit a period of suspension 12 imposed under this chapter toward the period of suspension required 13 under Section 106.041, Alcoholic Beverage Code, or Subchapter O, Chapter 521, or Subchapter H, Chapter 522, unless the person was 14 15 convicted of an offense under Article 67011-1, Revised Statutes, as 16 that law existed before September 1, 1994, Section 19.05(a)(2), Penal Code, as that law existed before September 1, 1994, Section 17 49.04, 49.045, 49.06, 49.07, or 49.08, Penal Code, or Section 18 106.041, Alcoholic Beverage Code, before the date of the conviction 19 20 on which the suspension is based, in which event credit may not be given. 21

SECTION 10. Subsections (a) and (d), Section 524.035,
 Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:

24 (a) The issues that must be proved at a hearing by a25 preponderance of the evidence are:

26 (1) whether:

27

(A) the person had an alcohol concentration of a

1 level specified by Section 49.01(2)(B), Penal Code, while operating 2 a motor vehicle in a public place or while operating a watercraft; 3 or

(B) the person was [is] a minor on the date that
the breath or blood specimen was obtained and had any detectable
amount of alcohol in the minor's system while operating a motor
vehicle in a public place or while operating a watercraft; and

8 (2) whether reasonable suspicion to stop or probable9 cause to arrest the person existed.

10 (d) An administrative law judge may not find in the 11 affirmative on the issue in Subsection (a)(1) if:

(1) the person is an adult and the analysis of the person's breath or blood determined that the person had an alcohol concentration of a level below that specified by Section 49.01, Penal Code, at the time the specimen was taken; or

16 (2) the person <u>was</u> [<del>is</del>] a minor <u>on the date that the</u> 17 <u>breath or blood specimen was obtained</u> and the administrative law 18 judge does not find that the minor had any detectable amount of 19 alcohol in the minor's system when the minor was arrested.

20SECTION 11. Subsection(a),Section524.042,21Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) A suspension of a driver's license under this chapter isstayed on the filing of an appeal petition only if:

(1) the person's driver's license has not been suspended as a result of an alcohol-related or drug-related enforcement contact during the five years preceding the date of the person's arrest; and

1 the person has not been convicted during the 10 (2) 2 years preceding the date of the person's arrest of an offense under: (A) Article 67011-1, Revised Statutes, as that 3 4 law existed before September 1, 1994; 5 (B) Section 19.05(a)(2), Penal Code, as that law existed before September 1, 1994; 6 7 (C) Section 49.04, 49.045, or 49.06, Penal Code; Section 49.07 or 49.08, Penal Code, if the 8 (D) 9 offense involved the operation of a motor vehicle or a watercraft; 10 or Section 106.041, Alcoholic Beverage Code. 11 (E) SECTION 12. The 12 changes in law to Chapter 524, Transportation Code, apply only to an offense committed on or after 13 the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the 14 effective date of this Act is covered by the law in effect when the 15 16 offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for For purposes of this section, an offense was 17 that purpose. committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of 18 the offense was committed before that date. 19 20 SECTION 13. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
