## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the adjudication of certain gang-related delinquent
3	conduct.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 54, Family Code, is amended by adding
6	Section 54.0491 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 54.0491. GANG-RELATED CONDUCT. (a) In this section:
8	(1) "Criminal street gang" has the meaning assigned by
9	Section 71.01, Penal Code.
10	(2) "Gang-related conduct" means conduct that
11	violates a penal law of the grade of Class B misdemeanor or higher
12	and in which a child engages with the intent to:
13	(A) further the criminal activities of a criminal
14	street gang of which the child is a member;
15	(B) gain membership in a criminal street gang; or
16	(C) avoid detection as a member of a criminal
17	street gang.
18	(b) A juvenile court, in a disposition hearing under Section
19	54.04 regarding a child who has been adjudicated to have engaged in
20	delinquent conduct that is also gang-related conduct, shall order
21	the child to participate in a criminal street gang intervention
22	program that is appropriate for the child based on the child's level
23	of involvement in the criminal activities of a criminal street
24	gang. The intervention program:

- 1 (1) must include at least 12 hours of instruction; and
- 2 (2) may include voluntary tattoo removal.
- 3 (c) If a child required to attend a criminal street gang
- 4 <u>intervention program is committed to the Texas Youth Commission as</u>
- 5 a result of the gang-related conduct, the child must complete the
- 6 intervention program before being discharged from the custody of or
- 7 released under supervision by the commission.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 54.0491, Family Code, as added by this
- 9 Act, applies only to conduct that violates a penal law of this state
- 10 and occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. Conduct that
- 11 violates a penal law of this state and occurs before the effective
- 12 date of this Act is covered by the law in effect at the time the
- 13 conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 14 purpose. For purposes of this section, conduct occurs before the
- 15 effective date of this Act if each element of the violation occurred
- 16 before that date.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
