4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 421.0025, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsections (g) and (h) to read as follows:
7	(g) The Border Security Council shall annually submit to the
8	governor a report regarding criminal street gangs and gang-related
9	crime. The report must be approved by a majority of the council
10	members and must include:
11	(1) an evaluation of the threat that criminal street
12	gangs and gang-related crime pose to the infrastructure of the
13	state, each county, and each municipality with a population of more
14	than 100,000; and
15	(2) recommendations on actions that may be taken to:
16	(A) prevent criminal street gangs from
17	<pre>committing human trafficking offenses;</pre>
18	(B) reduce criminal street gang violence;
19	(C) prevent the growth and proliferation of
20	criminal street gangs; and
21	(D) ensure that law enforcement personnel
22	receive the necessary training and education to effectively deal
23	with the problems created by criminal street gangs and gang-related
24	<u>crime.</u>

1 (h) On request, the office of the attorney general, the 2 Department of Public Safety, the Texas Violent Gang Task Force, the 3 Gang Resource System, the Texas Fusion Center, criminal justice 4 agencies, and juvenile justice agencies shall provide information 5 relating to criminal street gangs and gang-related crime to the 6 Border Security Council.

7 SECTION 2. The Border Security Council shall submit the 8 first annual report regarding criminal street gangs and 9 gang-related crime to the governor as required by Section 10 421.0025(g), Government Code, as added by this Act, not later than 11 September 1, 2010.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
