## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the authority of physicians to delegate to certain
3	pharmacists the implementation and modification of a patient's drug
4	therapy.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 157.101, Occupations Code, is amended by
7	adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
8	(b-1) A delegation under Subsection (b) may include the
9	implementation or modification of a patient's drug therapy under a
10	protocol, including the authority to sign a prescription drug order
11	for dangerous drugs, if:
12	(1) the delegation follows a diagnosis, initial
13	patient assessment, and drug therapy order by the physician;
14	(2) the pharmacist practices in a hospital,
15	hospital-based clinic, or an academic health care institution;
16	(3) the hospital, hospital-based clinic, or academic
17	health care institution in which the pharmacist practices has
18	bylaws and a medical staff policy that permit a physician to
19	delegate to a pharmacist the management of a patient's drug
20	therapy;
21	(4) the pharmacist provides the name, address, and
22	telephone number of the pharmacist and of the delegating physiciar
23	on each prescription signed by the pharmacist; and
24	(5) the pharmacist provides a copy of the protocol to

- 2 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 554, Occupations Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Section 554.017 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 554.017. LIST OF PHARMACISTS AUTHORIZED TO SIGN
- 5 PRESCRIPTION DRUG ORDERS. The board shall provide on its Internet
- 6 website a list of pharmacists who are authorized to sign a
- 7 prescription drug order under Section 157.101(b-1), including the
- 8 name of the pharmacist's delegating physician under the protocol
- 9 required under that subsection.
- 10 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 554, Occupations Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Section 554.057 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 554.057. RULEMAKING; IMPLEMENTATION OF DRUG THERAPY
- 13 UNDER PROTOCOL. The board, with the advice of the Texas Medical
- 14 Board, shall adopt rules that allow a pharmacist to implement or
- 15 modify a patient's <u>drug</u> therapy pursuant to a physician's
- 16 delegation under Section 157.101(b-1).
- SECTION 4. Not later than December 1, 2009, the Texas State
- 18 Board of Pharmacy shall adopt rules under Section 554.057,
- 19 Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
