A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

ı	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to a competitive grant program to fund promotion of early
- 3 literacy programs in certain communities in this state.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 73, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Subchapter I to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER I. COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM TO PROMOTE EARLY LITERACY
- 8 <u>Sec. 73.601. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:</u>
- 9 (1) "Competitive grant program" means the competitive
- 10 grant program to promote early literacy established under this
- 11 subchapter.
- 12 (2) "Health care practitioner" has the meaning
- 13 assigned by Section 112.001, Occupations Code.
- 14 (3) "Health science center" means The University of
- 15 Texas Health Science Center at Houston.
- 16 (4) "Literacy program" means a program to promote
- 17 early literacy.
- 18 Sec. 73.602. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM TO
- 19 PROMOTE EARLY LITERACY. (a) The University of Texas Health
- 20 <u>Science Center at Houston shall establish a competitive grant</u>
- 21 program to promote early literacy through which the health science
- 22 center will award grants for the implementation of literacy
- 23 programs, or the expansion of existing programs, and for the
- 24 operation of those programs for a period of not less than two years.

1 (b) The health science center shall award grants under the 2 program to applicants, including applicants operating existing programs, in a manner that ensures that the literacy programs 3 4 collectively: 5 (1) operate in multiple communities that are geographically distributed throughout this state; and 6 7 (2) provide program services to approximately 50,000 children. 8 9 Sec. 73.603. LITERACY PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS. literacy program funded through a grant awarded under this 10 11 subchapter must: (1) strictly adhere to the program model developed by 12 13 the Reach Out and Read National Center, including any clinical, programmatic, and data collection requirements of that model; 14 15 (2) provide matching funds in an amount equal to the 16 amount of the grant funds awarded under this subchapter; 17 (3) require that health care practitioners volunteer 18 to: (A) in conjunction with performing well-child 19 20 examinations, provide books to children and encourage parents to read to their children to develop preliteracy skills; 21 22 (B) maintain waiting rooms that encourage 23 children to read; and (C) provide services designed to increase the 24 25 school readiness of children receiving program services; and (4) partner with local adult literacy providers to 26

encourage parent literacy in appropriate circumstances.

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- 1 (b) Matching funds under Subsection (a)(2) may include
- 2 <u>in-kind contributions.</u>
- 3 Sec. 73.604. APPLICATION. (a) A public or private entity,
- 4 including a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of
- 5 this state, may apply for a grant under this subchapter.
- 6 (b) To apply for a grant, an applicant must submit a written
- 7 application to the health science center on a form prescribed by the
- 8 health science center in consultation with the Reach Out and Read
- 9 National Center.
- 10 Sec. 73.605. ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS IN AWARDING GRANTS.
- 11 In addition to the factors described by Sections 73.602(b) and
- 12 73.603, in determining whether to award a grant to an applicant
- 13 under this subchapter, the health science center may consider:
- 14 <u>(1) the demonstrated need for a literacy program in</u>
- 15 the community in which the applicant proposes to operate or expand
- 16 the program, which the health science center shall determine by
- 17 considering:
- 18 (A) the poverty rate, the crime rate, the number
- 19 of births to Medicaid recipients, the rate of poor birth outcomes,
- 20 and the incidence of referrals of elementary school students for
- 21 remedial instruction or special education services, and of child
- 22 abuse and neglect, during a prescribed period in the community; and
- 23 (B) the need to enhance school readiness in the
- 24 community;
- 25 (2) the applicant's ability to participate in ongoing
- 26 monitoring and performance evaluations under Section 73.608,
- 27 including the applicant's ability to collect and provide

- 1 information requested by the health science center under Section
- 2 <u>73.608(d);</u>
- 3 (3) the applicant's ability to adhere to the literacy
- 4 program guidelines published under Section 73.606;
- 5 (4) the applicant's ability to develop broad-based
- 6 community support for implementing or expanding a literacy program,
- 7 as applicable; and
- 8 <u>(5) the applicant's history of developing and</u>
- 9 sustaining innovative, high-quality programs that meet the needs of
- 10 families and communities.
- 11 Sec. 73.606. LITERACY PROGRAM GUIDELINES. The health
- 12 science center, with the assistance of the Reach Out and Read
- 13 National Center, shall publish guidelines for the literacy programs
- 14 funded under this subchapter. The guidelines must adhere to the
- 15 Reach Out and Read national program model standards and guidelines
- 16 that have been tested and replicated in multiple communities.
- Sec. 73.607. USE OF PROGRAM FUNDS. (a) In addition to
- 18 awarding grants under this subchapter, the health science center
- 19 may use program funds to:
- 20 (1) administer the competitive grant program; and
- 21 (2) purchase or contract to purchase discounted books
- 22 for use by grant recipients.
- (b) A grant recipient may use grant funds awarded under this
- 24 <u>subchapter only to cover costs related to implementing or expanding</u>
- 25 and operating a literacy program, including costs related to:
- 26 (1) administering the literacy program;
- 27 (2) training and managing health care practitioners

- 1 who volunteer to participate in the literacy program; and
- 2 (3) purchasing or contracting to purchase discounted
- 3 books for use in the literacy program.
- 4 Sec. 73.608. PROGRAM MONITORING AND EVALUATION; ANNUAL
- 5 COMMITTEE REPORTS. (a) The health science center, with the
- 6 assistance of the Reach Out and Read National Center, shall publish
- 7 performance indicators that are designed to measure a grant
- 8 recipient's performance with respect to the literacy program
- 9 guidelines published under Section 73.606.
- 10 (b) The health science center shall:
- 11 (1) use the performance indicators published under
- 12 Subsection (a) to continuously monitor and formally evaluate on an
- 13 annual basis the performance of each grant recipient; and
- 14 (2) prepare and submit an annual report, not later
- 15 than December 1 of each year, to the Senate Committee on Education,
- or its successor, and the House Public Education Committee, or its
- 17 successor, regarding the performance of each grant recipient during
- 18 the preceding state fiscal year with respect to providing literacy
- 19 program services.
- 20 (c) The report required under Subsection (b)(2) must
- 21 include:
- 22 (1) the number of low-income children receiving
- 23 <u>literacy program services;</u>
- 24 (2) the number of health care practitioners who
- 25 participate in the program and the estimated value of the services
- 26 provided by those practitioners under the program; and
- 27 (3) the extent to which each grant recipient adhered

- 1 to the Reach Out and Read national program model.
- 2 (d) On request, each grant recipient shall timely collect
- 3 and provide data and any other information required by the health
- 4 science center to monitor and evaluate the recipient or to prepare
- 5 the report required by this section.
- 6 Sec. 73.609. COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM FUNDING. (a) The
- 7 health science center shall actively seek and apply for any
- 8 available federal funds to assist in financing the competitive
- 9 grant program established under this subchapter.
- 10 (b) The health science center may use appropriated funds
- 11 from the state government and may accept gifts, donations, grants
- 12 of money, and in-kind contributions from the federal government,
- 13 <u>local governments, private corporations, or other persons to assist</u>
- 14 in financing the competitive grant program.
- 15 SECTION 2. The University of Texas Health Science Center at
- 16 Houston shall:
- 17 (1) as soon as practicable, apply for any available
- 18 federal funds to assist in financing the competitive grant program
- 19 under Subchapter I, Chapter 73, Education Code, as added by this
- 20 Act, as required by Section 73.609, Education Code, as added by this
- 21 Act;
- 22 (2) not later than December 1, 2009, submit a report to
- 23 the Senate Committee on Education, or its successor, and the House
- 24 Public Education Committee, or its successor, regarding the
- 25 implementation and status of the competitive grant program required
- 26 by Subchapter I, Chapter 73, Education Code, as added by this Act;
- 27 (3) not later than September 1, 2010, establish and

- 1 implement the competitive grant program required by Subchapter I,
- 2 Chapter 73, Education Code, as added by this Act, and, with the
- 3 assistance of the Reach Out and Read National Center, publish the
- 4 quidelines required by Section 73.606, Education Code, as added by
- 5 this Act; and
- 6 (4) not later than December 1, 2011, submit the
- 7 initial annual report required by Subdivision (2), Subsection (b),
- 8 Section 73.608, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act does not make an appropriation. A
- 10 provision in this Act that creates a new governmental program,
- 11 creates a new entitlement, or imposes a new duty on a governmental
- 12 entity is not mandatory during a fiscal period for which the
- 13 legislature has not made a specific appropriation to implement the
- 14 provision.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
