4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:							
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle E, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is							
6	amended by adding Chapter 115 to read as follows:							
7	CHAPTER 115. EARLY CHILDHOOD HEALTH AND NUTRITION INTERAGENCY							
8	COUNCIL							
9	Sec. 115.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "council" means							
10	the Early Childhood Health and Nutrition Interagency Council.							
11	Sec. 115.002. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The Early							
12	Childhood Health and Nutrition Interagency Council is subject to							
13	Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued							
14	in existence as provided by that chapter, the council is abolished							
15	and this chapter expires September 1, 2019.							
16	Sec. 115.003. COMPOSITION OF COUNCIL; PRESIDING OFFICER.							
17	(a) The Department of Agriculture shall establish the Early							
18	Childhood Health and Nutrition Interagency Council. The council is							
19	composed of six members as follows:							
20	(1) a representative of the Health and Human Services							
21	Commission's Office of Program Coordination for Children and Youth,							
22	appointed by the executive commissioner of the Health and Human							
23	Services Commission;							
24	(2) a representative of the Department of State Health							

- 1 Services' Chronic Disease Prevention Branch, appointed by the
- 2 commissioner of state health services;
- 3 (3) a representative of the Texas Workforce
- 4 Commission, appointed by the executive director of the Texas
- 5 Workforce Commission;
- 6 (4) a representative of the Department of Agriculture,
- 7 appointed by the commissioner of agriculture;
- 8 <u>(5) a representative of the Texas Education Agency's</u>
- 9 Health and Safety Division, appointed by the commissioner of
- 10 education; and
- 11 (6) a representative of the Department of Family and
- 12 Protective Services' Child Care Licensing Division, appointed by
- 13 the commissioner of the Department of Family and Protective
- 14 Services.
- (b) The representative appointed under Subsection (a)(4)
- shall serve as the presiding officer of the council.
- 17 Sec. 115.004. DEPARTMENT DUTIES. The Department of
- 18 Agriculture shall provide staff and resources as necessary for the
- 19 operation of the council.
- Sec. 115.005. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Members of the council
- 21 serve staggered, two-year terms, with the terms of members
- 22 appointed under Sections 115.003(a)(1) through (3) expiring
- 23 February 1 of each odd-numbered year and the terms of members
- 24 appointed under Sections 115.003(a)(4) through (6) expiring
- 25 February 1 of each even-numbered year.
- 26 (b) A member may be reappointed.
- (c) A vacancy on the council shall be filled for the

- 1 remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as provided by
- 2 Section 115.003(a).
- 3 Sec. 115.006. MEETINGS. (a) The council shall meet in
- 4 person once each quarter and hold at least four meetings by
- 5 conference call each year. The council may invite stakeholders to
- 6 participate in council meetings. Section 551.125, Government Code,
- 7 applies to a meeting held by conference call under this section,
- 8 except that Section 551.125(b) does not apply.
- 9 (b) Not later than August 1, 2010, the council shall provide
- 10 three or more opportunities for public input, including two or more
- 11 public hearings, to receive stakeholder input. This subsection
- 12 expires September 1, 2010.
- Sec. 115.007. COUNCIL POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The council
- 14 shall conduct research to assess:
- 15 (1) the health of children under the age of five in
- 16 this state compared to the health of similar children in other
- 17 states;
- 18 <u>(2) the significance of nutrition and physical</u>
- 19 activity in the development of children under the age of six; and
- 20 <u>(3) the effectiveness of nutrition and physical</u>
- 21 <u>activity requirements and practices in early childhood care</u>
- 22 settings.
- 23 (b) The council shall review the status of the programs
- 24 administered by each agency represented on the council that promote
- 25 health and nutrition in early childhood care settings.
- 26 (c) The council shall consult with key stakeholders to
- 27 identify:

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- 3 (2) best practices for improving early childhood
- 4 health through nutrition and physical activity.
- 5 (d) The council may contract with a university to study and
- 6 report on best practices and obstacles for addressing early
- 7 <u>childhood health through nutrition and physical activity.</u>
- 8 Sec. 115.008. COMPENSATION; REIMBURSEMENT. (a) A member
- 9 of the council may not receive compensation for service on the
- 10 <u>council.</u>
- 11 (b) A member shall be reimbursed for the member's actual and
- 12 necessary expenses for meals, lodging, transportation, and
- 13 incidental expenses incurred while performing council business,
- 14 subject to any applicable limitation on reimbursement prescribed by
- the General Appropriations Act.
- Sec. 115.009. EARLY CHILDHOOD NUTRITION AND ACTIVITY PLAN.
- 17 (a) The council shall develop an early childhood nutrition and
- 18 activity plan for implementation over a six-year period. The plan
- 19 must address the financing, staffing, and training required to
- 20 implement the plan and must include methods to:
- 21 (1) increase fruit and vegetable consumption among
- 22 children under the age of six;
- 23 <u>(2) increase daily structured and unstructured</u>
- 24 physical activity in early childhood care settings;
- 25 (3) increase awareness among parents of the benefits
- 26 of breast-feeding;
- 27 (4) facilitate the consumption of breast milk in early

- childhood care settings;
- 2 (5) decrease malnutrition and undernourishment among
- 3 children under the age of six; and
- 4 (6) engage existing community and state resources and
- 5 service providers to educate and increase the awareness of parents
- 6 and caretakers regarding the need for proper nutrition.
- 7 (b) The council, not later than November 1, 2010, shall
- 8 submit a written early childhood nutrition and activity plan to the
- 9 <u>legislature and the governor.</u> This subsection expires December 1,
- 10 2010.
- 11 Sec. 115.010. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The council
- 12 may accept a gift, grant, or donation from any source to carry out
- 13 the purposes of this chapter.
- 14 Sec. 115.011. REPORT. The council shall submit to both
- houses of the legislature and the governor on or before November 1
- of each even-numbered year a written report on:
- 17 (1) the actions taken in furtherance of the six-year
- 18 plan; and
- 19 (2) the areas that need improvement in implementing
- 20 the plan.
- 21 Sec. 115.012. RULES. The commissioner of agriculture may
- 22 adopt rules necessary to implement this chapter.
- 23 SECTION 2. (a) The Early Childhood Health and Nutrition
- 24 Interagency Council shall submit an initial report required under
- 25 Section 115.011, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, not
- later than November 1, 2012.
- 27 (b) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this

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- 1 Act, the designated appointing officials shall appoint the members
- 2 to the Early Childhood Health and Nutrition Interagency Council
- 3 established under Chapter 115, Health and Safety Code, as added by
- 4 this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
