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        Sec. 115.002. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The Early Childhood Health and Nutrition Interagency Council is subject to
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        Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued
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        in existence as provided by that chapter, the council is abolished
        and this chapter expires September 1, 2019.

Sec. 115.003. COMPOSITION OF COUNCIL; PRESIDING OFFICER.

(a) The Department of Agriculture shall establish the Early
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        Childhood Health and Nutrition Interagency Council. The council is
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        composed of seven members as follows:
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        (1) a representative of the Health and Human Services Commission who is involved in the coordination of children's programs, appointed by the executive commissioner of the Health and
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        Human Services Commission;
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                         (2) a representative of the Department of State Health

                                  promotion and chronic disease prevention
        programs, appointed by the commissioner of state health services;

(3) a representative of the Department of State Health Services' Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women,

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        Workforce Commission;
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                        (5) a representative of the Department of Agriculture,

Sec. 115.004. DEPARTMENT DUTIES. The Department Agriculture shall provide staff and resources as necessary for the operation of the council.

Sec. 115.005. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Members of the council serve two-year terms, with the terms expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered year.

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(b) A member may be reappointed.(c) A vacancy on the council shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as provided by Section 115.003(a).

MEETINGS. (a) The council shall meet in Sec. 115.006.

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person three times each year and may hold meetings by conference 2 - 1call as necessary. The council shall invite stakeholders to 2-2 participate in at least two council meetings each year and provide 2 - 32-4 an opportunity for submission of oral or written testimony. 2**-**5 2**-**6 council at a minimum shall invite:

(1) one individual with expertise in early childhood nutrition and physical activity, such as a registered dietician,

physical therapist, or physical education specialist;

(2) one staff member or manager of child-care facility;

staff member or one manager of a child-care facility operated in a private residence;

(c) Not later than August 1, 2010, the council shall provide three or more opportunities for public input, including two or more public hearings, to receive stakeholder input. This subsection expires September 1, 2010.

Sec. 115.007. COUNCIL POWERS AND DUTIES.
shall review current research to assess:

(a) The council

(1) the health of children under the age of six in this state compared to the health of similar children in other states;

(2) the significance of nutrition and physical activity in the development of children under the age of six; and

(3) the existence of nutrition and physical activity

requirements and practices in early childhood care settings.

(b) The council shall review the status of the programs administered by each agency represented on the council that promote healthy nutrition and physical activity in early childhood care settings.

The council shall identify existing state and federal funding sources available for the promotion of health and nutrition

in early childhood care settings.
(d) The council shall consult with key stakeholders to identify:

barriers to improving nutrition and physical activity standards in early childhood care settings; and

(2) evidence-based best practices for improving early childhood health through nutrition and physical activity.

(e) The Department of Agriculture for the council may

contract with a university to study and report on best practices and obstacles for addressing early childhood health through nutrition and physical activity.

Sec. 115.008. COMPENSATION; REIMBURSEMENT. (a) A member the council may not receive compensation for service on the

council.

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A member may be reimbursed for the member's actual and (b) necessary expenses for meals, lodging, transportation, and incidental expenses incurred while performing council business, subject to any applicable limitation on reimbursement prescribed by the General Appropriations Act.

Sec. 115.009. EARLY CHILDHOOD NUTRITION AND PHYSICAL ACTIVITY PLAN. (a) The council shall develop an early childhood nutrition and physical activity plan with a recommended timeline

for implementation over a six-year period.

(c) The council, not later than November 1, 2010, shall submit a written early childhood nutrition and physical activity plan to the legislature and the governor. This subsection expires <u>December 1, 2010.</u>

Sec. 115.010. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The Department of Agriculture for the council may accept a gift, grant, or donation from any source to carry out the purposes of this chapter.

Sec. 115.011. REPORT. The council shall submit houses of the legislature and the governor on or before November 1 of each even-numbered year a written report on:

the actions taken in furtherance of the six-year plan;

(2)the areas that need improvement in implementing the six-year plan;

(3) any change to the six-year plan; and

(4) the programs and practices that address nutrition and physical activity in early childhood settings in this state.

Sec. 115.012. RULES. The commissioner of agriculture may

adopt rules necessary to implement this chapter.

SECTION 2. (a) The Early Childhood Health and Nutrition Interagency Council shall submit an initial report required under Section 115.011, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, not later than November 1, 2012.

(b) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the designated appointing officials shall appoint the members to the Early Childhood Health and Nutrition Interagency Council established under Chapter 115, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
