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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the establishment and implementation of a school-based 3 influenza vaccination pilot program. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. (a) The Department of State Health Services and the Texas Education Agency shall jointly establish and implement 6 for the 2009-2010 school year a school-based influenza vaccination 7 pilot program using both killed vaccine and live attenuated vaccine 8 9 in: (1) a school district with a student population of 10 11 50,000 or more that is at least 85 percent economically 12 disadvantaged and located in a home-rule municipality with a population of more than 1.1 million; 13 14 (2) a school district with a student population that is less than five percent economically disadvantaged and located in 15 16 a municipality with a population of more than 600,000 and less than one million; and 17 18 (3) two school districts selected by the Texas Immunization Stakeholder Working Group including: 19 (A) one school district with a student population 20 21 that is at least 90 percent economically disadvantaged and located in a county with a population of 50,000 or less; and 22 23 (B) one school district with a student population 24 that is at least 90 percent economically disadvantaged and located

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1 in a county on the international border.

(b) The Texas Immunization Stakeholder Working Group shall
establish within the working group a pilot program subcommittee
composed of representatives from:

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the Texas Pediatric Society;

the Texas Academy of Family Physicians;

7 (3) each school district in which the pilot program
8 will operate, after the selection of those districts under
9 Subsection (a) of this section;

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(4) the state Medicaid medical director; and

(5) each local health department that serves the geographic area in which a participating school district is located.

(c) Members of the Texas Immunization Stakeholder Working
Group that do not serve on the pilot program subcommittee shall
serve in an advisory role for the planning and implementation of the
school-based influenza vaccination pilot program.

(d) The Department of State Health Services, the Texas
Education Agency, and the pilot program subcommittee shall plan the
school-based influenza vaccination pilot program established and
implemented under this section.

(e) The Department of State Health Services, the TexasEducation Agency, and the pilot program subcommittee shall:

(1) implement the school-based influenza vaccination
pilot program in the school districts selected under Subsection (a)
of this section for the 2009-2010 school year; and

27 (2) collect all relevant data related to the program

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1 during the 2009-2010 school year.

Not later than December 1, 2010, the Department of State 2 (f) Health Services and the Texas Education Agency shall submit to the 3 lieutenant governor, speaker of the 4 governor, house of 5 representatives, and presiding officers of each standing committee of the legislature with jurisdiction over the department and the 6 agency a jointly written report on the implementation and results 7 8 of the school-based influenza vaccination pilot program that includes: 9

10 (1) an analysis of the costs and benefits of 11 implementing the school-based influenza vaccination pilot program 12 in each school district listed by Subsection (a) of this section;

13 (2) identification of barriers to implementing the
 14 pilot program and recommendations for removing those barriers;

15 (3) a projection of the fiscal impact of implementing
16 a statewide school-based influenza vaccination program; and

17 (4) an analysis of the pilot program's impact on 18 private practice physicians who administer influenza vaccination 19 in this state.

20 (g) The Department of State Health Services and the Texas 21 Education Agency may seek, receive, and spend money received 22 through an appropriation, grant, donation, or reimbursement from 23 any public or private source to implement the school-based 24 influenza vaccination pilot program.

25 SECTION 2. This Act expires September 1, 2011.

26 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
