## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to requiring certain service stations to be capable of
3	operating with alternative electrical power and to have an
4	alternative electrical generator.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 5, Business & Commerce Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 106 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 106. ALTERNATIVE ELECTRICAL POWER REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN
9	SERVICE STATIONS
10	Sec. 106.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
11	(1) "Alternative electrical generator" means an
12	electrical generator that provides electric power when electric
13	power from a utility service is interrupted.
14	(2) "Service station" has the meaning assigned by
15	<u>Section 105.001.</u>
16	Sec. 106.002. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER. (a) This chapter
17	applies only to a self-service, full-service, or combination of
18	self-service and full-service service station that is located
19	within 100 miles of the Gulf of Mexico or of a bay or inlet of the
20	gulf.
21	(b) This chapter applies to a service station described by
22	Subsection (a) regardless of whether the service station is located
23	on the grounds of, or is owned by, another business entity that does
24	not engage in the business of selling motor vehicle fuel to the

1 public. 2 (c) This chapter does not apply to: 3 (1) an automobile dealer; 4 (2) a person who operates a fleet of motor vehicles; or 5 (3) a person who sells motor fuel exclusively to a 6 fleet of motor vehicles. 7 Sec. 106.003. ALTERNATIVE ELECTRICAL POWER CAPACITY FOR SERVICE STATIONS. (a) A service station shall be prewired with an 8 9 appropriate transfer switch and be capable of operating all fuel pumps, dispensing equipment, life-safety systems, 10 and payment-acceptance equipment using an alternative electrical 11 12 generator. (b) Installation of appropriate wiring and transfer 13 14 switches must be performed by an electrical contractor. 15 (c) If a local government requires a certificate of occupancy for completion of construction of a service station, the 16 17 local government may not issue a certificate of occupancy to the service station unless the local government determines that the 18 service station has the equipment and operational capabilities 19 required by Subsection (a). 20 21 Sec. 106.004. ALTERNATIVE ELECTRICAL GENERATOR REQUIRED. A service station shall be equipped with at least one alternative 22 electrical generator for use at the station. 23 24 Sec. 106.005. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR SERVICE STATIONS. (a)

A service station must keep a copy of the documentation of the

installation of appropriate wiring for the operation of an

alternative electrical generator, including a transfer switch,

- 1 <u>on-site or at its corporate headquarters.</u>
- 2 (b) A service station must keep a written statement
- 3 <u>attesting to the periodic testing and ensured operational capacity</u>
- 4 of the equipment.
- 5 <u>(c) The documents required by this section must be made</u>
- 6 available, on request, to the governor's division of emergency
- 7 management or the Department of Agriculture.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect June 1, 2010.
