- SECTION 1. Section 7.052(c), Water Code, is amended to read 5
- 6 as follows:
- Except as provided by Section 7.0526, the [The] amount 7 (c)
- of the penalty for all other violations within the jurisdiction of 8
- the commission to enforce may not exceed \$10,000 a day for each 9
- violation. 10
- SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 7, Water Code, is amended 11
- 12 by adding Section 7.0526 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 7.0526. PENALTIES FOR CERTAIN VIOLATIONS OF CLEAN AIR
- ACT. (a) In this section, "major source" has the meaning assigned 14
- by Section 501 of the federal Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. Section 15
- 16 7661).
- (b) For a violation of Chapter 382, Health and Safety Code, 17
- 18 committed by a major source that is required to obtain a permit
- under that chapter, the commission shall assess a penalty in an 19
- amount that is equal to or more than the total of: 20
- 21 (1) the economic benefit gained through the violation,
- 22 including any costs avoided due to the violation; and
- 23 (2) the amount necessary to deter future violations.
- 24 (c) For purposes of assessing a penalty for a violation of

- 1 Chapter 382, Health and Safety Code, against a major source that is
- 2 required to obtain a permit under that chapter, each day that a
- 3 <u>continuing violation occurs is a separate violation.</u>
- SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only 4 to a violation of Chapter 382, Health and Safety Code, that occurs 5 on or after the effective date of this Act. A violation of Chapter 6 382, Health and Safety Code, that occurs before the effective date 7 of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the violation 8 occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that 9 purpose. For purposes of this section, a violation occurs before 10 the effective date of this Act if any element of the violation 11 occurs before that date. 12
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
