## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the adoption of an alternative base period for
- 3 computation of unemployment compensation benefits.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subdivision (1), Section 201.011, Labor Code, is
- 6 repealed.
- 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 201, Labor Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 201.013 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 201.013. DEFINITION OF BASE PERIOD; ALTERNATE BASE
- 10 PERIODS. (a) For purposes of this subtitle and subject to this
- 11 section, an individual's base period is the four consecutive
- 12 completed calendar quarters, prescribed by the commission, in the
- 13 five consecutive completed calendar quarters preceding the first
- 14 day of an individual's benefit year.
- 15 (b) For an individual precluded because of a medically
- 16 verifiable injury or illness from working during a major part of a
- 17 calendar quarter of the period that would otherwise be the
- 18 individual's base period under Subsection (a), the base period is
- 19 the first four calendar quarters of the five consecutive calendar
- 20 quarters preceding the calendar quarter in which the illness began
- 21 or the injury occurred if the individual files an initial claim for
- 22 benefits not later than 24 months after the date on which the
- 23 <u>individual's injury or illness began or occurred.</u>
- (c) For an individual who does not have sufficient benefit

- 1 wage credits to qualify for benefits under the computation of the
- 2 base period as provided by Subsection (a) or (b), the base period is
- 3 the four most recently completed calendar quarters preceding the
- 4 first day of the individual's benefit year.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act applies only to eligibility for
- 6 unemployment compensation benefits based on a claim that is filed
- 7 with the Texas Workforce Commission on or after the effective date
- 8 of this Act. A claim filed before the effective date of this Act is
- 9 governed by the law in effect on the date the claim was filed, and
- 10 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
