- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 472.034, Transportation Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 472.034. STANDARDS OF CONDUCT; ETHICS POLICY. (a) A
- 8 policy board member or employee of a metropolitan planning
- 9 organization may not:
- 10 (1) accept or solicit any gift, favor, or service that
- 11 might reasonably tend to influence the member or employee in the
- 12 discharge of official duties or that the member or employee knows or
- 13 should know is being offered with the intent to influence the
- 14 member's or employee's official conduct;
- 15 (2) accept other employment or engage in a business or
- 16 professional activity that the member or employee might reasonably
- 17 expect would require or induce the member or employee to disclose
- 18 confidential information acquired by reason of the official
- 19 position;
- 20 (3) accept other employment or compensation that could
- 21 reasonably be expected to impair the member's or employee's
- 22 independence of judgment in the performance of the member's or
- 23 employee's official duties;
- 24 (4) make personal investments that could reasonably be

expected to create a substantial conflict between the member's or 1 2 employee's private interest and the public interest; or 3 (5) intentionally or knowingly solicit, accept, or agree to accept any benefit for having exercised the member's or 4 employee's official powers or performed the member's or employee's 5 official duties in favor of another. 6 7 (b) An employee of a metropolitan planning organization who violates Subsection (a) or an ethics policy adopted under 8 Subsection (c) is subject to termination of the employee's 9 another employment-related or 10 employment sanction. Notwithstanding this subsection, a policy board member or employee 11 of a metropolitan planning organization who violates Subsection (a) 12 13 is subject to any applicable civil or criminal penalty if the violation also constitutes a violation of another statute or rule. 14 15 (c) Each policy board shall: 16 (1) adopt bylaws establishing an ethics policy for employees of a metropolitan planning organization and policy board 17 18 members consistent with the standards prescribed by Subsection (a), including provisions to prevent a policy board member from having a 19 20 conflict of interest in business before the metropolitan planning 21 organization; and 22 (2) distribute a copy of the ethics policy to: 23 (A) each new employee not later than the third business day after the date the person begins employment with the 24 25 agency; and

(B) each new policy board member not later than

- 1 office.
- 2 (d) If a person with knowledge of a violation of an ethics
- 3 policy established under Subsection (c) that also constitutes a
- 4 criminal offense under another law of this state reports the
- 5 violation to an appropriate prosecuting attorney who concludes that
- 6 there is reasonable basis to initiate an investigation, then, not
- 7 <u>later than the 60th day after the date a person notifies the</u>
- 8 prosecuting attorney under this subsection, the prosecuting
- 9 attorney shall notify the Texas Ethics Commission of the status of
- 10 the prosecuting attorney's investigation of the alleged violation.
- 11 The Texas Ethics Commission shall, on the request of the
- 12 prosecuting attorney, assist the prosecuting attorney in
- 13 investigating the alleged violation.
- 14 (e) To the extent an employee of a metropolitan planning
- 15 organization is subject to the ethics policy of another
- 16 governmental entity and to the extent that policy conflicts with
- 17 this section, the ethics policy of the other governmental entity
- 18 prevails.
- 19 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2010, each policy board
- 20 of a metropolitan planning organization shall adopt bylaws
- 21 establishing an ethics policy as required by Subsection (c),
- 22 Section 472.034, Transportation Code, as added by this Act, and
- 23 distribute a copy of the ethics policy to each policy board member
- 24 and employee.
- 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
