Chapter 531, Government Code, is amended by 5 adding Subchapter S to read as follows: 6 7 SUBCHAPTER S. EVIDENCE-BASED YOUTH DEVELOPMENT COMPETITIVE GRANT 8 PILOT PROGRAM Sec. 531.751. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "adolescent" 9 means a person who is at least 12 years of age but younger than 18 10 years of age. 11 12 Sec. 531.752. ESTABLISHMENT OF EVIDENCE-BASED YOUTH DEVELOPMENT COMPETITIVE GRANT PILOT PROGRAM. (a) The commission 13 14 shall establish an evidence-based youth development competitive grant pilot program to award grants for the implementation, 15 expansion, and operation of evidence-based youth development 16 programs designed to provide information and guidance for not more 17 than 75 adolescents in making healthy and beneficial life choices. 18 (b) The pilot program shall be located in Bexar County and 19 serve regions that are: 20 21 (1) located in zip codes in which the school-age birth rate is at least three times the national school-age birth rate; and 22 23 (2) served by one or more school districts in which: 24 (A) at least 90 percent of the student population

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S.B. No. 591 1 is economically disadvantaged; and 2 (B) the annual dropout rate for grades 7 through 3 12 is greater than five percent. 4 Sec. 531.753. EVIDENCE-BASED YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM 5 REQUIREMENTS. (a) An evidence-based youth development program funded through a grant awarded under this subchapter must: 6 7 (1) target adolescents who: 8 (A) are at risk of becoming pregnant or causing an unplanned pregnancy or already have a child; 9 10 (B) are at risk of engaging in delinquent conduct or conduct indicating a need for supervision, as those terms are 11 12 defined by Section 51.03, Family Code; (C) are at risk of dropping out of school; 13 14 (D) live in foster care or in a facility operated 15 by the state; or 16 (E) live in economically disadvantaged 17 circumstances; (2) feature a curriculum that is appropriate for 18 19 adolescents and that has been demonstrated to reduce school dropout 20 and adolescent pregnancy rates; 21 (3) include a community service component of not fewer 22 than 20 hours each year; (4) include at least one activity session or group 23 24 discussion each week; and 25 (5) cover a wide variety of developmental topics of 26 interest to adolescents, including: 27 (A) development of values and good judgment;

1	(B) communication and assertiveness;
2	(C) healthy relationships;
3	(D) influence of others and peer pressure;
4	(E) goal-setting;
5	(F) decision-making;
6	(G) development and human sexuality;
7	(H) preparation for participation in community
8	service activities;
9	(I) community service learning; and
10	(J) group reflection on community service
11	experiences.
12	(b) An evidence-based youth development program must
13	operate for not less than nine months or an academic school year.
14	Sec. 531.754. APPLICATION. (a) A public or private entity,
15	including a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of
16	this state, may apply for a grant under this subchapter by
17	submitting a written application to the commission on a form
18	prescribed by the commission.
19	(b) The application prescribed by the commission must:
20	(1) require the applicant to provide data on the
21	number of adolescents who will receive assistance through the
22	program;
23	(2) describe the ongoing monitoring and evaluation
24	process to which a grant recipient is subject, including the
25	recipient's obligation to collect and provide information
26	requested by the commission; and
27	(3) require the applicant to provide other relevant

1 information as determined by the commission. 2 Sec. 531.755. ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS IN AWARDING GRANTS. In determining whether to award a grant under this 3 subchapter, the commission shall consider: 4 5 (1) the demonstrated need for an evidence-based youth development program in the community in which the applicant 6 7 proposes to operate or expand the program, as determined by: 8 (A) the poverty rate; 9 (B) the crime rate; 10 (C) the school-age birth rate; 11 (D) the rate of drug and alcohol abuse; and 12 (E) the annual dropout rate for grades 7 through 13 12; 14 (2) the applicant's ability to participate in ongoing 15 monitoring and performance evaluations, including the applicant's ability to collect and provide information required by the 16 17 commission; (3) the applicant's ability to adhere to the 18 19 evidence-based youth development program operating and performance 20 standards; 21 (4) the applicant's ability to develop broad-based community support for implementing or expanding an evidence-based 22 youth development program, as applicable; and 23 24 (5) the applicant's history of developing and sustaining innovative, high-quality programs that meet the needs of 25 26 families and communities. 27 Sec. 531.756. EVIDENCE-BASED YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

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1	STANDARDS. The executive commissioner, in accordance with the
2	goals and requirements established by this subchapter, shall adopt
3	standards for an evidence-based youth development program awarded a
4	grant under this subchapter.
5	Sec. 531.757. USE OF AWARDED GRANT FUNDS. The grant funds
6	awarded under this subchapter may be used only to cover costs
7	related to implementing, expanding, or operating an evidence-based
8	youth development program, including costs related to:
9	(1) administering the program, including:
10	(A) appropriate local site selection; and
11	(B) required evaluation and quality monitoring;
12	(2) training and managing staff;
13	(3) paying staff salaries and expenses; and
14	(4) paying for program facilities and equipment.
15	Sec. 531.758. EVIDENCE-BASED YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM
16	MONITORING AND EVALUATION; COMMITTEE REPORT. (a) The executive
17	commissioner shall adopt performance indicators designed to
18	measure a grant recipient's performance with respect to the
19	evidence-based youth development program standards adopted by the
20	executive commissioner under Section 531.756.
21	(b) The commission shall use the performance indicators to
22	monitor and evaluate the performance of each grant recipient.
23	(c) Not later than December 1, 2010, the commission shall
24	submit a report to the Senate Health and Human Services Committee,
25	or its successor, and the House Human Services Committee, or its
26	successor, regarding the performance of each grant recipient with
27	respect to providing evidence-based youth development program

1 services, including: 2 (1) the number of low-income adolescents served by an evidence-based youth development program and, of that number, the 3 number of adolescents who subsequently became pregnant or caused a 4 5 pregnancy; and 6 (2) any other information required by the commission. 7 (d) On request, each grant recipient shall timely collect and provide data and any other information required by the 8 commission to monitor and evaluate the recipient or to prepare the 9 10 report required by this section. Sec. 531.759. EVIDENCE-BASED YOUTH DEVELOPMENT COMPETITIVE 11 12 GRANT PILOT PROGRAM FUNDING. (a) The commission shall actively seek and apply for any available federal funds or grants from any 13 14 source to assist in financing the competitive grant pilot program 15 established under this subchapter. (b) The commission may use appropriated funds and may accept 16 17 gifts, donations, and grants of money from the federal government, local governments, private corporations, or other persons to assist 18 19 in financing the competitive grant pilot program. Sec. 531.760. EXPIRATION. 20 This subchapter expires September 1, 2011. 21 SECTION 2. (a) The Health and Human Services Commission 22 shall, as soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, 23 24 apply for any available funds or grants to assist in financing the evidence-based youth development competitive grant pilot program 25 26 created by this Act. Not later than December 1, 2009, the Health and Human 27 (b)

Services Commission shall establish and implement the
evidence-based youth development competitive grant pilot program
created by this Act.

4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
