- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subsection (d), Section 87.841, Education Code,
- 7 is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subchapter,
- 9 Texas A&M University--San Antonio may not operate as a general
- 10 academic teaching institution until the Texas Higher Education
- 11 Coordinating Board certifies that enrollment at the Texas A&M
- 12 University--Kingsville System Center--San Antonio has reached an
- 13 enrollment equivalent of [+
- 14 $\left[\frac{(1)}{1}\right]$ 1,000 full-time students for one semester $\left[\frac{if}{1}\right]$
- 15 the legislature authorizes revenue bonds to be issued to finance
- 16 educational and related facilities for the institution, and the
- 17 bonds are issued for that purpose; or
- [(2) 2,500 full-time students for one semester if the
- 19 conditions specified by Subdivision (1) are not satisfied].
- SECTION 2. Subsection (e), Section 55.1751, Education Code,
- 21 is amended to read as follows:
- (e) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), The Texas A&M
- 23 University System may not issue bonds under this section for
- 24 facilities at Texas A&M University--San Antonio until the Texas

- 1 Higher Education Coordinating Board certifies that enrollment at
- 2 Texas A&M University--San Antonio has reached an enrollment
- 3 equivalent of 1,000 [1,500] full-time students for one
- 4 semester. [If that enrollment is not reached by January 1, 2010,
- 5 the system's authority to issue bonds for Texas A&M University--San
- 6 Antonio under this section expires on that date.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each House, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
