A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the creation of the Texas Center for Sustainable
3	Business.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 447, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Section 447.014 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 447.014. CENTER FOR SUSTAINABLE BUSINESS. (a) To
8	assist Texas businesses in reducing greenhouse gas emissions and
9	transitioning successfully to a low-carbon economy, the state
10	energy conservation office shall establish and oversee the Texas
11	Center for Sustainable Business.
12	(b) The center shall develop a sustainable business action
13	plan that will provide a balanced assessment of strategies for
14	assisting businesses in reducing their greenhouse gas emissions.
15	(c) The state energy conservation office may employ an
16	executive director for the center and may contract with a private
17	entity or an institution of higher education to assist in
18	performing the duties of the center.
19	(d) The state energy conservation office shall appoint the
20	sustainable business advisory council. Membership on the advisory
21	council shall consist of at least one representative from each of
22	the following:
23	(1) the electric utility industry;
24	(2) the manufacturing industry;

1	(3) the petrochemical industry;
2	(4) the environmental industry;
3	(5) the transportation industry;
4	(6) the building industry;
5	(7) higher education; and
6	(8) state government.
7	(e) The center may establish other advisory councils, task
8	forces, or commissions it deems necessary to accomplish the
9	center's purposes under this section.
10	(f) In developing the sustainable business action plan
11	required by Subsection (b), the center shall:
12	(1) work with the Texas Commission on Environmental
13	Quality and the United States Environmental Protection Agency to
14	create an accounting of greenhouse gas emissions in this state;
15	(2) determine the total amount of carbon dioxide
16	emissions in this state in 2005 and recommend practices,
17	strategies, and policies that will reduce greenhouse gas emissions
18	in this state to within a range of 97 percent to 102 percent of 2005
19	levels by 2012, to within a range of 80 percent to 86 percent of 2005
20	levels by 2020, to 58 percent of 2005 levels by 2030, and to 20
21	percent of 2005 levels by 2050;
22	(3) establish a registry of actions to reduce carbon
23	dioxide emissions that have been taken by Texas businesses since
24	January 1, 2000, and work with the United States Environmental
25	Protection Agency to recognize and give credit for early action
26	under federal carbon emissions limits adopted after September 1,

2009;

(4) identify and prioritize strategies for reducing
emissions of greenhouse gases in this state that will result in net
savings or in no additional financial cost to consumers or
businesses of this state;
(5) identify, assess, and promote commercialization
of technology that will achieve the greatest greenhouse gas
reductions at the lowest cost;
(6) identify available grants for applied research to
develop new technologies and other practical solutions to reduce
greenhouse gas emissions; and
(7) assess the costs and benefits of joining the
Southwest Climate Change Initiative or another regional
initiative.
(g) The center annually shall submit a plan to the governor
and the legislature presenting the assessments and recommendations
required by Subsection (f).
SECTION 2. The Texas Center for Sustainable Business is
eligible to receive grants from the Texas Enterprise Fund to fund
its duties under Section 447.014, Government Code, as added by this
Act, during the state fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2009.
SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
