- 2 relating to modifications, adjustments, and reimbursements under
- 3 the public school finance system and contract delegation authority
- 4 for a school district located in a disaster area.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 42, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 42.0051 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 42.0051. AVERAGE DAILY ATTENDANCE FOR DISTRICTS IN
- 9 DISASTER AREA. (a) The commissioner shall adjust the average
- 10 daily attendance of a school district all or part of which is
- 11 located in an area declared a disaster area by the governor under
- 12 Chapter 418, Government Code, if the district experiences a decline
- 13 in average daily attendance that is reasonably attributable to the
- 14 <u>impact of the disaster.</u>
- 15 (b) The adjustment must be sufficient to ensure that the
- 16 district receives funding comparable to the funding that the
- 17 district would have received if the decline in average daily
- 18 attendance reasonably attributable to the impact of the disaster
- 19 had not occurred.
- 20 <u>(c) The commissioner shall make the adjustment required by</u>
- 21 this section for the two-year period following the date of the
- 22 governor's initial proclamation or executive order declaring the
- 23 state of disaster.
- 24 (d) Section 42.005(b)(2) does not apply to a district that

- 1 receives an adjustment under this section.
- 2 <u>(e)</u> A district that receives an adjustment under this
- 3 section may not receive any additional adjustment under Section
- 4 42.005(d) for the decline in average daily attendance on which the
- 5 <u>adjustment under this section is based.</u>
- 6 (f) For purposes of this title, a district's adjusted
- 7 average daily attendance under this section is considered to be the
- 8 <u>district's average daily attendance as determined under Section</u>
- 9 42.005.
- 10 SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 42, Education Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Sections 42.2523 and 42.2524 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 42.2523. ADJUSTMENT FOR PROPERTY VALUE AFFECTED BY
- 13 STATE OF DISASTER. (a) For purposes of Chapters 41 and 46 and this
- 14 chapter, the commissioner shall adjust the taxable value of
- 15 property of a school district all or part of which is located in an
- 16 area declared a disaster area by the governor under Chapter 418,
- 17 Government Code, as necessary to ensure that the district receives
- 18 funding based as soon as possible on property values as affected by
- 19 the disaster.
- 20 (b) Any additional funding to which a school district is
- 21 entitled as a result of the adjustment required by this section is
- 22 <u>in addition to the amount of funding to which the district is</u>
- 23 entitled under Section 42.2516(b).
- (c) A decision of the commissioner under this section is
- 25 final and may not be appealed.
- Sec. 42.2524. REIMBURSEMENT FOR DISASTER REMEDIATION
- 27 COSTS. (a) This section applies only to a school district all or

- 1 part of which is located in an area declared a disaster area by the
- 2 governor under Chapter 418, Government Code, and that incurs
- 3 disaster remediation costs as a result of the disaster.
- 4 (b) During the two-year period following the date of the
- 5 governor's initial proclamation or executive order declaring a
- 6 state of disaster, a district may apply to the commissioner for
- 7 reimbursement of disaster remediation costs that the district pays
- 8 during that period and does not anticipate recovering through
- 9 insurance proceeds, federal disaster relief payments, or another
- 10 similar source of reimbursement.
- 11 (b-1) A district may seek reimbursement of disaster
- 12 remediation costs paid by the district on or after September 1,
- 13 2008. This subsection expires September 1, 2011.
- 14 (c) The commissioner may provide reimbursement under this
- 15 section only if:
- 16 (1) funds are specifically appropriated for purposes
- 17 of this section; or
- 18 (2) Foundation School Program funds are available for
- 19 purposes of this section, based on a determination by the
- 20 commissioner that the amount appropriated for the Foundation School
- 21 Program, including the facilities component as provided by Chapter
- 22 46, exceeds the amount to which districts are entitled under this
- 23 chapter and Chapter 46.
- 24 <u>(d) A district seeking reimbursement under this section</u>
- 25 must provide the commissioner with adequate documentation of the
- 26 costs for which the district seeks reimbursement.
- (e) If the amount of money available for purposes of this

- 1 section is not sufficient to fully reimburse each district's
- 2 disaster remediation costs, the commissioner shall reduce the
- 3 amount of assistance provided under this section to each district
- 4 proportionately.
- 5 (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a district
- 6 that is required to purchase attendance credits under Chapter 41 is
- 7 eligible to receive assistance under this section in the same
- 8 manner as any other district. A district may, at its discretion,
- 9 receive assistance either as a payment of state aid under this
- 10 chapter or as a reduction in the total amount required to be paid by
- 11 the district for attendance credits under Section 41.093.
- 12 (g) Amounts provided to a district under this section are in
- 13 addition to the amount to which the district is entitled under
- 14 Section 42.2516.
- 15 (h) The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to
- 16 implement this section, including rules defining "disaster
- 17 remediation costs" for purposes of this section and specifying the
- 18 type of documentation required under Subsection (d).
- (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section,
- 20 the commissioner may permit a district to use amounts provided to a
- 21 district under this section to pay the costs of replacing a facility
- 22 <u>instead of repairing the facility. The commissioner shall ensure</u>
- 23 that a district that elects to replace a facility does not receive
- 24 an amount under this section that exceeds the lesser of:
- 25 (1) the amount that would be provided to the district
- 26 if the facility were repaired; or
- 27 (2) the amount necessary to replace the facility.

- 1 (j) This section does not require the commissioner to
- 2 provide any requested reimbursement. A decision of the
- 3 commissioner regarding reimbursement is final and may not be
- 4 appealed.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 44.0312, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 7 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, in the
- 8 event of a catastrophe, emergency, or natural disaster affecting a
- 9 school district, the board of trustees of the district may delegate
- 10 to the superintendent or designated person the authority to
- 11 contract for the replacement, construction, or repair of school
- 12 equipment or facilities under this subchapter if emergency
- 13 replacement, construction, or repair is necessary for the health
- 14 and safety of district students and staff.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act does not make an appropriation. This
- 16 Act takes effect only if a specific appropriation for the
- 17 implementation of the Act is provided in a general appropriations
- 18 act of the 81st Legislature.
- 19 SECTION 5. Except as provided by Section 4 of this Act, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
