A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of a student mentorship pilot program
3	at certain institutions of higher education.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 61.0593 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 61.0593. STUDENT MENTORSHIP PILOT PROGRAM. (a) The
8	board shall establish a pilot program under which students enrolled
9	in their senior year at a participating general academic teaching
10	institution are paid to mentor incoming freshman students at the
11	institution in an effort to increase the retention and success of
12	those students.
13	(b) The board shall select not more than five general
14	academic teaching institutions to participate in the pilot program
15	from among institutions that apply to participate in the manner
16	prescribed by board rule.
17	(c) In consultation with general academic teaching
18	institutions, the board shall adopt rules consistent with this
19	section as necessary to implement this section, including rules
20	establishing:
21	(1) the manner in which:
22	(A) an institution may apply to participate in
23	the pilot program; and
24	(B) institutions and students are selected to

- 1 participate in the pilot program; 2 (2) the requirements for participating in the pilot 3 program; 4 (3) general guidelines for the mentoring to be 5 provided under the pilot program, including guidelines for the methods and content the board considers most critical to ensuring 6 student retention and success; and 7 8 (4) criteria to ensure that each student providing mentoring under the pilot program: 9 10 (A) receives appropriate training and 11 supervision; and 12 (B) is paid at least the minimum wage required by law. 13 14 (d) The pilot program may be funded by: 15 (1) legislative appropriations; or 16 (2) gifts, grants, and donations described by 17 Subsection (e). (e) The board may so<u>licit</u> and accept gifts, grants, and 18 19 donations from any public or private source for the purposes of this 20 section. 21 (f) Not later than December 1, 2010, the board shall submit 22 a report to the legislature on: 23 (1) the progress of and level of participation in the 24 pilot program; and 25 (2) the impact of the pilot program on the retention

and success of students receiving mentoring under the program.

(g) This section expires September 1, 2011.

SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall adopt the rules required by Section 61.0593, Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after this Act takes effect. For that purpose, the coordinating board may adopt the

initial rules in the manner provided by law for emergency rules.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
