- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 2161.001, Government Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subdivision (3) and adding Subdivision (5) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (3) "Economically disadvantaged person" means a
- 10 person who is economically disadvantaged because of the person's
- 11 identification as a member of a certain group, including Black
- 12 Americans, Hispanic Americans, women, Asian Pacific Americans,
- 13 [and] Native Americans, and disabled veterans, and who has suffered
- 14 the effects of discriminatory practices or other similar insidious
- 15 circumstances over which the person has no control.
- 16 (5) "Disabled veteran" means a veteran of the armed
- 17 services of the United States who is classified as disabled by the
- 18 Veterans' Administration or its successor or the branch of the
- 19 armed services in which the veteran served and whose disability is
- 20 <u>service-connected</u>. The term does not include a person having a less
- 21 than honorable discharge from military service.
- 22 SECTION 2. Section 2161.125, Government Code, is amended to
- 23 read as follows:
- Sec. 2161.125. CATEGORIZATION OF HISTORICALLY

- 1 <u>UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESSES</u> [BY SEX, RACE, AND ETHNICITY]. The
- 2 comptroller, in cooperation with each state agency reporting under
- 3 this subchapter, shall categorize each historically underutilized
- 4 business included in a report under this subchapter by sex, race,
- 5 and ethnicity and by whether the historically underutilized
- 6 <u>business</u> derives its status as a historically underutilized
- 7 business because it is owned or owned, operated, and controlled, as
- 8 applicable, wholly or partly by one or more disabled veterans.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
