Subtitle F, Title 16, Property Code, is amended by adding Chapter 447 to read as follows: 15 CHAPTER 447. REQUIREMENTS FOR NEW CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS 16 Sec. 447.001. SOLAR PANEL OPTION REQUIRED IN CERTAIN 17 SUBDIVISIONS. (a) In this section, "solar energy device" means a 18 system or series of mechanisms designed primarily to provide 19 heating or cooling or to produce electrical or mechanical power by 20 collecting and transferring solar-generated energy. The term 21 includes a mechanical or chemical device that has the ability to 22 23 store solar-generated energy for use in heating or cooling or in the production of power. 24

1 (b) This chapter applies only to a contract for construction 2 of a new home in a subdivision that contains more than 50 lots on 3 which the builder has built or is offering to build new homes.

4 (c) A builder who enters into a contract to which this
5 chapter applies shall offer the home buyer an option to install a
6 solar energy device on the home for heating or cooling or for the
7 production of power.

8 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only 9 to a contract for new home construction entered into on or after the 10 effective date of this Act. A contract entered into before the 11 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect 12 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is 13 continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
