A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to certain standards for group-administered achievement tests used by school districts. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 39.032, Education Code, is amended by 5 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (c-1) to 6 read as follows: 7 (a) A company or organization may not distribute to, sell 8 to, or grade for the same school district the same form of an 9 assessment instrument for more than eight [three] school years. A 10 11 school district may not use the same form of an assessment 12 instrument for more than <u>eight</u> [three] years. <u>This subsection does</u> not apply if another form of a particular assessment instrument 13 14 does not exist. (c) State and national norms of averages shall be computed 15 16 using data that: (1) are not more than <u>eight</u> [six] years old at the time 17 the assessment instrument is administered, unless only data older 18 than eight years old are available; and 19 20 (2) [that] are representative of the group of students 21 to whom the assessment instrument is administered. 22 (c-1) The standardization norms computed under Subsection 23 (c) shall be based on a national probability sample that meets accepted standards for educational and psychological testing and, 24

using proven psychometric procedures approved by the State Board of 1 Education, shall be updated at least every eight [six] years, 2 unless sufficient data to update the sample are not available 3 4 [using proven psychometric procedures approved by the State Board of Education]. 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 6 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 9

10 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
