- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Subsection (b), Section 262.1015, Family Code,
- 5 is amended to read as follows:
- 6 (b) A court may issue a temporary restraining order in a
- 7 suit by the department for the removal of an alleged perpetrator
- 8 under Subsection (a) if the department's petition states facts
- 9 sufficient to satisfy the court that:
- 10 (1) there is an immediate danger to the physical
- 11 health or safety of the child or the child has been a victim of
- 12 sexual abuse;
- 13 (2) there is no time, consistent with the physical
- 14 health or safety of the child, for an adversary hearing;
- 15 (3) the child is not in danger of abuse from a parent
- 16 or other adult with whom the child will continue to reside in the
- 17 residence of the child; [and]
- 18 (4) the parent or other adult with whom the child will
- 19 continue to reside in the child's home is likely to:
- 20 <u>(A) make a reasonable effort to monitor the</u>
- 21 <u>residence; and</u>
- 22 (B) report to the department and the appropriate
- 23 law enforcement agency any attempt by the alleged perpetrator to
- 24 return to the residence; and

- 1 $\underline{\text{(5)}}$ the issuance of the order is in the best interest
- 2 of the child.
- 3 SECTION 2. Subsection (b), Section 262.102, Family Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 (b) In determining whether the circumstances described by
- 6 Subsections (a)(1) and (2) exist [there is an immediate danger to
- 7 the physical health or safety of a child], the court shall [may]
- 8 consider whether the child's household includes a person who has:
- 9 (1) abused or neglected another child in a manner that
- 10 caused serious injury to or the death of the other child; or
- 11 (2) sexually abused another child.
- 12 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act to Subsection
- 13 (b), Section 262.1015, Family Code, applies only to a petition for a
- 14 temporary restraining order in a suit by the Department of Family
- 15 and Protective Services filed on or after the effective date of this
- 16 Act. A petition filed before the effective date of this Act is
- 17 governed by the law in effect on the date the petition was filed,
- 18 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
