| 5 | SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is |
| 6 | amended by adding Section 531.0226 to read as follows: |
| 7 | Sec. 531.0226. SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT EVALUATION. |
| 8 | (a) The commission shall monitor the provision of comprehensive |
| 9 | substance abuse treatment, as described by Section 32.024(ff), |
| 10 | Human Resources Code, to Medicaid recipients who are at least 21 |
| 11 | years of age and analyze data relating to the provision of those |
| 12 | services. The commission shall provide the data to the Legislative |
| 13 | Budget Board in the format and at the times requested by the |
| | |

- (b) The data analyzed and provided under Subsection (a) 15
- 16 must:
- 17 (1) be measured in three consecutive years, including
- the year before the year in which the recipient receives

comprehensive substance abuse treatment, the year in which the

- treatment is first provided to the recipient, and the year 20
- 21 following the year in which the treatment is first provided to the
- 22 recipient; and

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- (2) include at least the following: 23
- 24 (A) the number of recipients to whom

| 20 | Subsection (b). |
| 21 | (d) The commission shall ensure that data is analyzed using: |
| 22 | (1) appropriate demographic categories, including |
| 23 | recipient age, disability, and income; and |
| 24 | (2) the type of service delivery model through which |
| 25 | the recipient received services through Medicaid, including the |
| 26 | fee-for-service, primary care case management, and health |
| 27 | maintenance organization models. |

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- 1 (e) Using the data provided by the commission, the
- 2 <u>Legislative Budget Board shall evaluate cost and utilization trends</u>
- 3 and whether the provision of comprehensive substance abuse
- 4 <u>treatment through the state Medicaid program results in an increase</u>
- 5 <u>in overall Medicaid spending.</u> Not later than February 1, 2013, the
- 6 Legislative Budget Board shall prepare and publish a report of the
- 7 data. The Legislative Budget Board shall provide a draft of the
- 8 report to the commission before publishing the report.
- 9 (f) If the Legislative Budget Board determines that the
- 10 provision of comprehensive substance abuse treatment through the
- 11 state Medicaid program has resulted in an increase in overall
- 12 Medicaid spending, the commission may not continue to provide those
- 13 services to a Medicaid recipient who is at least 21 years of age.
- 14 (g) This section expires March 1, 2013.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 32.024, Human Resources Code, is amended
- 16 by adding Subsection (ff) to read as follows:
- 17 (ff) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, the
- 18 department shall provide comprehensive substance abuse treatment
- 19 under the medical assistance program to a person who is at least 21
- 20 years of age, has a substance abuse disorder, and otherwise
- 21 qualifies for medical assistance. The department may not provide
- 22 the treatment if, based on the data evaluated under Section
- 23 <u>531.0226</u>, Government Code, the Legislative Budget Board determines
- 24 that the treatment resulted in an increase in overall medical
- 25 <u>assistance program spending.</u> Comprehensive substance abuse
- 26 treatment includes assessment, residential detoxification,
- 27 outpatient detoxification, medication-assisted treatment,

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- 1 residential services, specialized residential services for women,
- 2 outpatient chemical dependency counseling, and any other necessary
- 3 services as determined by the department.
- 4 SECTION 3. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 5 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 6 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 7 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 8 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 9 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
