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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of medical radiologic technology.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 601.002, Occupations Code, is amended by
5	adding Subdivisions (10-a) and (10-b) to read as follows:
6	(10-a) "Radiologist" means a physician specializing
7	in radiology certified by or board-eligible for the American Board
8	of Radiology, the American Osteopathic Board of Radiology, the
9	British Royal College of Radiology, or the Canadian College of
10	Physicians and Surgeons. This definition does not alter or affect
11	the term "chiropractic radiologist."
12	(10-b) "Radiologist assistant" means an
13	advanced-level medical radiologic technologist certified under
14	this chapter, other than a practitioner, who is registered with the
15	American Registry of Radiologic Technologists and credentialed to
16	provide radiology services under the supervision of a radiologist.
17	SECTION 2. Section 601.053, Occupations Code, is amended to
18	read as follows:
19	Sec. 601.053. MINIMUM STANDARDS. The board by rule shall
20	establish minimum standards for:
21	(1) issuing, renewing, suspending, or revoking a
22	certificate issued under this chapter;
23	(2) approving curricula and education programs to
24	train <u>:</u>

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1 (A) individuals, registered nurses, and 2 physician assistants to perform radiologic procedures; and 3 radiologist assistants to provide radiology (B) services under the supervision of a radiologist; 4 5 approving instructors to teach approved curricula (3) 6 or education programs to train: 7 (A) individuals to perform radiologic procedures; and 8 (B) radiologist assistants to provide radiology 9 services under the supervision of a radiologist; and 10 11 (4) rescinding an approval described by Subdivision (2) or (3). 12 SECTION 3. Subsections 13 (a) and (b), Section 601.056, Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows: 14 15 (a) The board with the assistance of other appropriate state 16 agencies shall identify by rule radiologic procedures, other than radiologic procedures described by Subsection (c), that are 17 dangerous or hazardous and that may be performed only by a 18 practitioner or a medical radiologic technologist or radiologist 19 20 assistant certified under this chapter. In adopting rules under Subsection (a), the board may 21 (b) 22 consider whether the radiologic procedure will be performed by a registered nurse or a licensed physician assistant or a radiologist 23 24 assistant certified under this chapter. 25 SECTION 4. Section 601.058, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 26 27 Sec. 601.058. RULES RESTRICTING ADVERTISING OR COMPETITIVE

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1 BIDDING. (a) The board may not adopt rules restricting 2 advertising or competitive bidding by a medical radiologic 3 technologist <u>or radiologist assistant</u> except to prohibit false, 4 misleading, or deceptive practices.

5 (b) In its rules to prohibit false, misleading, or deceptive6 practices, the board may not include a rule that:

7 (1) restricts the use of any medium for advertising;

8 (2) restricts the use of a medical radiologic 9 technologist's <u>or radiologist assistant's</u> personal appearance or 10 voice in an advertisement;

11 (3) relates to the size or duration of an 12 advertisement by the medical radiologic technologist <u>or</u> 13 <u>radiologist assistant</u>; or

14 (4) restricts the medical radiologic technologist's <u>or</u>
 15 <u>radiologist assistant's</u> advertisement under a trade name.

SECTION 5. Subchapter C, Chapter 601, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 601.1055 to read as follows:

18 <u>Sec. 601.1055. RADIOLOGIST ASSISTANT CERTIFICATE. (a) A</u> 19 person seeking to obtain certification as a radiologist assistant 20 must:

21 (1) hold a general certificate to perform radiologic
22 procedures;

23 (2) have completed an advanced academic program
24 encompassing a nationally recognized radiologist assistant
25 curriculum that:

26 (A) culminates in the award of a baccalaureate
 27 degree, postbaccalaureate certificate, or graduate degree; and

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1	(B) incorporates a radiologist-directed clinical
2	preceptorship;
3	(3) be certified in advanced cardiac life support; and
4	(4) be registered with the American Registry of
5	Radiologic Technologists and credentialed as a radiologist
6	assistant to provide radiology services under the supervision of a
7	radiologist.
8	(b) The board, with the advice and consent of the Texas
9	Medical Board, by rule shall determine the scope of practice of and
10	qualifications to serve as a radiologist assistant. A rule adopted
11	under this subsection must be consistent with guidelines adopted by
12	the American College of Radiology, the American Society of
13	Radiologic Technologists, and the American Registry of Radiologic
14	Technologists.
15	(c) A radiologist may use the services of a radiologist
16	assistant to practice under the supervision of the radiologist to
17	the extent not prohibited by this chapter.
18	(d) A radiologist assistant may not interpret images, make
19	diagnoses, or prescribe medications or therapies.
20	SECTION 6. Subsections (b) and (c), Section 601.102,
21	Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
22	(b) The board may issue to a person:
23	(1) a general certificate to perform radiologic
24	procedures; [or]
25	(2) a limited certificate that authorizes the person
26	to perform radiologic procedures only on specific parts of the
27	human body <u>; or</u>

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(3) a certificate as a radiologist assistant.

2 (c) The board may issue to a person a temporary general 3 certificate or a temporary limited certificate that authorizes the 4 person to perform radiologic procedures for a period not to exceed 5 one year. <u>The board may issue to a person a temporary certificate</u> 6 <u>that authorizes the person to perform radiologic procedures as a</u> 7 radiologist assistant for a period not to exceed one year.

8 SECTION 7. Subsection (b), Section 601.108, Occupations 9 Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) The board shall prepare, recognize, or administer
 continuing education programs for medical radiologic technologists
 <u>and radiologist assistants</u> in which participation is required, to
 the extent required by the board, to keep the person's certificate.
 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
