## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 661.904(b) and (c), Government Code,
- 6 are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The employee on an unpaid leave of absence during
- 8 <u>military duty described by Subsection (a)</u> continues to accrue:
- 9 <u>(1)</u> state service credit for purposes of longevity 10 pay;
- 11 (2) [while on military duty described by Subsection
- 12 (a) but does not accrue] vacation leave; and
- 13 <u>(3)</u> [or] sick leave [during an unpaid leave of
- 14 absence].

- 15 (c) The employee may retain any accrued vacation or sick
- 16 leave and is entitled to be credited with those balances on return
- 17 to state employment from military duty described by Subsection (a).
- 18 Leave earned while on an unpaid leave of absence during military
- 19 duty described by Subsection (a) [in a state-paid status] is
- 20 credited to the employee's balance when the employee returns to
- 21 active state employment.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
