relating to powers of the Port of Corpus Christi Authority of Nueces 2 3 County, Texas, pertaining to land in and adjacent to Naval Station 4 Ingleside. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 397, Acts of the 68th Legislature, Regular Session, 1983, is amended by amending Section 1 and adding 7 Sections 1A and 4B to read as follows: 8 Sec. 1. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>. In this Act: 9 (1) "Adjacent property" means the approximately 433 10 acres that the authority owns in San Patricio County that is bounded 11 12 on the east by the western boundary of Naval Station Ingleside, on 13 the north by Farm-to-Market Road 1069, on the west by the city limits of the City of Ingleside on the Bay, and on the south by the 14 15 city limits of the City of Ingleside on the Bay and the north shoreline of Corpus Christi Bay. The term does not include property 16 17 that the authority purchased from this state under Article 8225, Revised Statutes, or that was granted to the authority by this state 18 under any general or special Act. 19 (2) "Authority" means the Port of Corpus Christi 20 Authority of Nueces County, Texas. 21 22 (3) "Naval property" means:

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submerged land in San Patricio and Nueces Counties, improvements,

(A) the approximately 576.615 acres of land and

- 1 and personal property, if any, that revert to the authority when
- 2 Naval Station Ingleside closes, other than property that the
- 3 authority purchased from this state under Article 8225, Revised
- 4 Statutes, or that was granted to the authority by this state under
- 5 any general or special Act; and
- 6 <u>(B) the adjacent property.</u>
- 7 (4) "Port commission" means the governing body of the
- 8 <u>authority</u>.
- 9 Sec. 1A. COMPOSITION OF PORT COMMISSION. The port
- 10 commission [of the Port of Corpus Christi Authority of Nueces
- 11 County, Texas, is composed of seven members.
- 12 Sec. 4B. USE AND DISPOSITION OF NAVAL PROPERTY. (a) The
- 13 authority may use the naval property in ways that replace and
- 14 enhance the economic benefits generated by Naval Station Ingleside
- 15 through diversified activities, including uses to foster:
- 16 (1) the creation and retention of new jobs;
- 17 (2) economic development;
- 18 <u>(3) industry;</u>
- 19 (4) commerce;
- 20 (5) manufacturing;
- 21 (6) housing;
- 22 <u>(7) recreation; and</u>
- 23 (8) the installation of infrastructure on the naval
- 24 property.
- 25 (b) The authority may contract with another person for
- 26 <u>assistance</u> in accomplishing the purposes of this section by
- 27 competitive bidding or negotiated contract as the port commission

- 1 considers appropriate, desirable, and in the best interests of the
- 2 authority.
- 3 (c) The port commission may declare any portion of the naval
- 4 property not needed for a navigation-related project surplus
- 5 property and may sell or lease the surplus property on terms the
- 6 port commission considers advisable to carry out the purposes of
- 7 this Act.
- 8 (d) Notwithstanding any other law, and subject to the terms
- 9 of this subsection, the authority may sell or lease property
- 10 declared surplus under this section with or without public bidding.
- 11 Naval property declared surplus under this section may not be sold
- 12 in a private sale for less than its fair market value. The
- 13 authority shall obtain an appraisal of the surplus property, and
- 14 the appraisal is conclusive evidence of the surplus property's fair
- 15 market value.
- (e) This section is cumulative of and in addition to other
- 17 law applicable to or affecting the authority. This section does not
- 18 limit the power of the authority to use other law not in conflict
- 19 with this Act to the extent necessary or convenient to carry out a
- 20 power expressly or impliedly granted by this section.
- 21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
