## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the duties of the interagency obesity council and the
- 3 Department of Agriculture relating to health, wellness, and
- 4 prevention of obesity.

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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 114, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 CHAPTER 114. INTERAGENCY OBESITY COUNCIL
- 9 Sec. 114.001. <u>DEFINITION</u>. In this chapter, "council" means
- 10 the interagency obesity council created by this chapter.
- 11 Sec. 114.002. INTERAGENCY OBESITY COUNCIL. The council is
- 12 composed of the  $[\frac{a}{The}]$  commissioner of agriculture, the
- 13 commissioner of state health services, and the commissioner of
- 14 education, or a staff member designated by each of those
- 15 commissioners.
- Sec. 114.003. CONTRACTS FOR ASSISTANCE. The council may
- 17 contract with a private or public university to assist in gathering
- 18 information under this chapter.
- Sec. 114.004. GIFTS AND GRANTS. An agency represented on
- 20 the council may accept gifts and grants on behalf of the council.
- 21 Sec. 114.005. REVIEW OF AGENCY PROGRAMS. The council  $[\tau]$
- 22 shall <u>review</u> [meet at least once a year as an interagency council
- 23 <del>to:</del>
- [(1) discuss] the status of the [each agency's]

- 1 programs of the Department of Agriculture, the Department of State
- 2 Health Services, and the Texas Education Agency that promote better
- 3 health and nutrition and prevent obesity among children and adults
- 4 in this state[; and
- 5 [(2) consider the feasibility of tax incentives for
- 6 employers who promote activities designed to reduce obesity in the
- 7 workforce].
- 8 Sec. 114.006. EVIDENCE-BASED PUBLIC HEALTH AWARENESS PLAN.
- 9 (a) The council shall create an evidence-based public health
- 10 awareness plan. In creating the plan, the council shall explore
- 11 past successful public health awareness efforts.
- 12 (b) The plan must include:
- 13 (1) a cost estimate that accounts for continuing
- 14 implementation of the plan;
- 15 (2) recommendations on reaching populations that
- 16 would most benefit from increased public health awareness; and
- 17 (3) recommendations on encouraging employers to
- 18 participate in wellness programs for employees.
- 19 (c) The council shall solicit input on the plan from the
- 20 private sector.
- 21 (d) The council shall provide to the Department of State
- 22 Health Services information on effective strategies for employers
- 23 to use to promote workplace wellness, including information on the
- 24 projected costs and benefits. The Department of State Health
- 25 Services shall post the information on its Internet website.
- Sec. 114.007. STATE-ENDORSED HEALTHY FOOD AND BEVERAGE
- 27 DESIGNATION. (a) The Department of Agriculture, in consultation

- 1 with the council, shall study the feasibility, practicality, and
- 2 potential benefit, cost, and revenue associated with creating a
- 3 state-endorsed "healthy food and beverage" designation.
- 4 (b) If the Department of Agriculture determines that the
- 5 creation and implementation of a "healthy food and beverage"
- 6 designation is feasible, the department, in consultation with the
- 7 council, shall identify ways to note the following information on
- 8 qualifying products:
- 9 (1) serving size;
- 10 (2) nutrient class or family; and
- 11 (3) the role of the product as part of a healthy,
- 12 well-balanced diet.
- 13 (c) Not later than January 15, 2011, the Department of
- 14 Agriculture shall submit a report to the governor, the lieutenant
- 15 governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives regarding
- 16 the feasibility of creating and implementing a state-endorsed
- 17 "healthy food and beverage" designation. The report required under
- 18 this subsection may be included with the report of the council
- 19 required under Section 114.008.
- 20 (d) The Department of Agriculture may contract with a
- 21 private or public university to assist in gathering information
- 22 <u>under this section</u>.
- (e) This section expires September 2, 2011.
- Sec. 114.008. REPORTS. (a)  $\left[\frac{b}{b}\right]$  Not later than January
- 25 15 of each odd-numbered year, the [interagency] council shall
- 26 submit a report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the
- 27 speaker of the house of representatives on the activities of the

- 1 council under Sections 114.005 and 114.006 during the preceding two
- 2 calendar years.
- 3 (b) [<del>(c)</del>] A report submitted by the [<del>interagency</del>] council
- 4 under Subsection (a) [(b)] must include the following information
- 5 regarding discussions of agency programs under Section 114.005:
- 6 (1) a list of the programs within each agency
- 7 <u>represented on the council</u> that are designed to promote better
- 8 health and nutrition;
- 9 (2) an assessment of the steps taken by each program
- 10 during the preceding two calendar years;
- 11 (3) a report of the progress made by taking these steps
- 12 in reaching each program's goals;
- 13 (4) the areas of improvement that are needed in each
- 14 program; and
- 15 (5) recommendations for future goals or legislation.
- (c) A report submitted by the council under Subsection (a)
- 17 must include the following information regarding the
- 18 <u>evidence-based public health awareness plan under Section 114.006:</u>
- 19 (1) a cost estimate for an ongoing program to
- 20 implement the plan;
- 21 (2) projected benefits of the program;
- 22 (3) a summary of the information provided to the
- 23 Department of State Health Services for its Internet website; and
- 24 (4) recommendations for goals and future legislation.
- Sec. 114.009. MEETINGS. (a) The council shall meet at
- 26 least once each year to perform its duties under Sections 114.005
- 27 and 114.006.

- 1 (b) [<del>(d)</del>] A meeting held under this <u>chapter</u> [<del>section</del>] is not
- 2 subject to the provisions of the open meetings law, Chapter 551,
- 3 Government Code.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
