S.B. No. 887

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the licensing and regulation of dentists, dental hygienists, dental assistants, and dental laboratories; providing 3 penalties. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 256.105(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 (a) Each dentist, dental hygienist, and owner or manager of 8 a dental laboratory licensed or registered with the board shall 9 timely notify the board of: 10 11 (1) any change of address of the person's place of 12 business; [and] 13 (2) any change of employers for the dentist or dental 14 hygienist and any change of owners or managers for the dental laboratory; and 15 (3) any change of the person's mailing address. 16 SECTION 2. Section 257.001, Occupations Code, is amended by 17 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows: 18 (d) An initial license issued under this subtitle expires on 19 the 30th day after the date the license is issued if the holder of 20 the license fails to pay the required license fee on or before that 21 date. 22 SECTION 3. Section 262.054(b), Occupations Code, is amended 23 to read as follows: 24

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(b) A member may serve for not more than two consecutive
 full terms [only one six-year term].

3 SECTION 4. Section 264.151, Occupations Code, is amended to 4 read as follows:

5 Sec. 264.151. CRIMINAL <u>PENALTIES</u> [PENALTY]. (a) A person 6 commits an offense if the person violates <u>Section 256.001</u> [this 7 subtitle]. <u>An offense under this subsection is a felony of the third</u> 8 degree. Each day of a violation is a separate offense.

9 (b) <u>A person commits an offense if the person violates</u> 10 <u>Section 256.052.</u> An offense under this <u>subsection</u> [section] is a 11 Class A misdemeanor. <u>If it is shown at the trial of an offense under</u> 12 <u>this subsection that the defendant has previously been convicted of</u> 13 <u>an offense for a violation of Section 256.052, the offense is a</u> 14 <u>felony of the third degree.</u>

15 (c) <u>A person commits an offense if the person violates</u> 16 <u>Subchapter D, Chapter 262. An offense under this subsection is a</u> 17 <u>Class A misdemeanor. Each day of a violation is a separate offense.</u> 18 [<u>A violation under this section does not include a violation to</u> 19 which Section 262.203 applies.]

A person commits an offense if the person is a dentist or 20 (d) dental hygienist and violates an injunction or cease and desist 21 order issued under Subchapter B. An offense under this subsection 22 is a Class A misdemeanor. If it is shown at the trial of an offense 23 24 under this subsection [section] that the defendant was previously convicted of an offense for a violation of an injunction or cease 25 and desist order issued under Subchapter B [under this section or if 26 the offense involves practicing without an appropriate board 27

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1 license], the offense is a felony of the third degree.

2 [(e)] Each day of a violation is a separate offense.
3 SECTION 5. Section 265.005, Occupations Code, is amended by
4 adding Subsections (m), (n), and (o) to read as follows:

5 (m) A dental assistant who holds a certificate of 6 registration issued under this section shall display the person's 7 current certificate of registration in each office in which the 8 person makes dental x-rays. If the person makes dental x-rays at 9 more than one location, the person may display a duplicate of the 10 original registration certificate obtained from the board on 11 payment of a duplicate certificate fee set by the board.

12 (n) A dental assistant who holds a certificate of 13 registration issued under this section shall timely notify the 14 board of:

15 (1) any change of address of the person's place of 16 business;

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(3) any change of the person's mailing address.

(2) any change of employers; and

19 (o) An initial certificate of registration issued under 20 this section expires on the 30th day after the date the certificate 21 is issued if the holder of the certificate fails to pay the required 22 certificate fee on or before that date.

23 SECTION 6. Section 266.101(a), Occupations Code, is amended 24 to read as follows:

(a) The council shall review each application for
 registration or renewal of registration to determine if the
 applicant meets the requirements of this chapter. [The council

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shall provide to the board a list of applicants eligible for 1 2 registration.] SECTION 7. Subchapter D, Chapter 266, Occupations Code, is 3 amended by adding Section 266.155 to read as follows: 4 5 Sec. 266.155. INITIAL REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE FEE. An initial registration certificate issued under this subchapter 6 expires on the 30th day after the date the registration certificate 7 8 is issued if the holder of the registration certificate fails to pay the required registration certificate fee on or before that date. 9 10 SECTION 8. Section 266.303, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsections (d) and (e) to read 11 12 as follows: (c) An offense for a violation of Section 266.301(c) [or 13 14 (d)] is a Class C misdemeanor. If it is shown on the trial of an 15 offense under this section that the defendant has previously been convicted for an offense for a violation of Section 266.301(c) 16 17 [under this subsection], the offense is a Class A misdemeanor. (d) An offense for a violation of Section 266.301(d) is a 18 19 Class B misdemeanor. If it is shown on the trial of an offense under this section that the defendant has previously been convicted of an 20 offense for a violation of Section 266.301(d), the offense is a 21 22 Class A misdemeanor. 23 (e) Each day of a violation is a separate offense. 24 SECTION 9. Section 262.203, Occupations Code, is repealed. SECTION 10. (a) The changes in law made by this Act by the 25

repeal of Section 262.203, Occupations Code, and the amendment of 26 Sections 264.151 and 266.303, Occupations Code, apply only to an 27

1 offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. For 2 purposes of this section, an offense is committed before the 3 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs 4 before that date.

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5 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this 6 Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, 7 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

8 SECTION 11. The changes in law made by this Act by the enactment of Sections 257.001(d), 265.005(o), and 266.155, 9 Occupations Code, apply only to a license, certificate of 10 registration, or registration certificate initially issued on or 11 after the effective date of this Act. A license, certificate of 12 registration, or registration certificate initially issued before 13 14 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on 15 the date the license, certificate of registration, or registration certificate is issued, and the former law is continued in effect for 16 17 that purpose.

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SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
