1-7 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-8 AN ACT

1-9 relating to inclusion in a public school campus improvement plan of
1-10 goals and objectives for the campus coordinated health program.

1-11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-12 SECTION 1. Subsection (d), Section 11.253, Education Code,
1-13 is amended to read as follows:

1-14 (d) Each campus improvement plan must:

1-15 (1) assess the academic achievement for each student
1-16 in the school using the academic excellence indicator system as
1-17 described by Section 39.051;

1-18 (2) set the campus performance objectives based on the
1-19 academic excellence indicator system, including objectives for
1-20 special needs populations, including students in special education
1-21 programs under Subchapter A, Chapter 29;

1-22 (3) identify how the campus goals will be met for each
1-23 student;

1-24 (4) determine the resources needed to implement the
1-25 plan;

1-26 (5) identify staff needed to implement the plan;

1-27 (6) set timelines for reaching the goals;

1-28 (7) measure progress toward the performance
1-29 objectives periodically to ensure that the plan is resulting in
1-30 academic improvement;

1-31 (8) include goals and methods for violence prevention
1-32 and intervention on campus; ~~and~~

1-33 (9) provide for a program to encourage parental
1-34 involvement at the campus; and

1-35 (10) if the campus is an elementary, middle, or junior
1-36 high school, set goals and objectives for the coordinated health
1-37 program at the campus based on:

1-38 (A) student fitness assessment data, including
1-39 any data from research-based assessments such as the school health
1-40 index assessment and planning tool created by the federal Centers
1-41 for Disease Control and Prevention;

1-42 (B) student academic performance data;

1-43 (C) student attendance rates;

1-44 (D) the percentage of students who are
1-45 educationally disadvantaged;

1-46 (E) the use and success of any method to ensure
1-47 that students participate in moderate to vigorous physical activity
1-48 as required by Section 28.002(1); and

1-49 (F) any other indicator recommended by the local
1-50 school health advisory council.

1-51 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010
1-52 school year.

1-53 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
1-54 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
1-55 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
1-56 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
1-57 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
