4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 167 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 167. REGULATION OF PAIN MANAGEMENT CLINICS
8	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
9	Sec. 167.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "pain
10	management clinic" means a publicly or privately owned facility for
11	which a majority of patients are issued on a monthly basis a
12	prescription for opioids, benzodiazepines, barbiturates, or
13	carisoprodol, but not including suboxone.
14	Sec. 167.002. EXEMPTIONS. This chapter does not apply to:
15	(1) a medical or dental school or an outpatient clinic
16	associated with a medical or dental school;
17	(2) a hospital, including any outpatient facility or
18	clinic of a hospital;
19	(3) a hospice established under 40 T.A.C. Section
20	97.403 or defined by 42 C.F.R. Section 418.3;
21	(4) a facility maintained or operated by this state;
22	(5) a clinic maintained or operated by the United
23	<u>States;</u>
24	(6) a health organization certified by the board under

Section 162.001; 1 (7) a clinic owned or operated by a physician who 2 3 treats patients within the physician's area of specialty and who uses other forms of treatment, including surgery, with the issuance 4 of a prescription for a majority of the patients; or 5 6 (8) a clinic owned or operated by an advanced practice 7 nurse licensed in this state who treats patients in the nurse's area of specialty and uses other forms of treatment with the issuance of 8 9 a prescription for a majority of the patients. 10 [Sections 167.003-167.050 reserved for expansion] SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES OF BOARD 11 Sec. 167.051. ADOPTION OF RULES. The board shall adopt 12 13 rules necessary to implement this chapter, including rules to address, for a pain management clinic: 14 15 (1) the operation of the clinic; 16 (2) personnel requirements for the clinic, including 17 requirements for a physician who practices at a clinic; 18 (3) standards to ensure quality of patient care; (4) certificate application and renewal procedures 19 20 and requirements; (5) inspections and complaint investigations; and 21 22 (6) patient billing procedures. Sec. 167.052. INSPECTIONS. The board may inspect a pain 23 management clinic, including the documents of a physician 24 practicing at the clinic, as necessary to ensure compliance with 25 26 this chapter. 27

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Sec. 167.053. COMPLAINTS. The board shall investigate a

1	complaint alleging a violation of this chapter or a rule adopted
2	under this chapter by a pain management clinic certified under this
3	chapter or a physician who owns or operates a clinic in the same
4	manner as other complaints under this subtitle.

6	SUBCHAPTER C. CERTIFICATION OF CLINIC
7	Sec. 167.101. CERTIFICATE REQUIRED. (a) A pain management
8	clinic may not operate in this state unless the clinic is certified
9	under this chapter.
10	(b) A certificate issued under this chapter is not
11	transferable or assignable.
12	Sec. 167.102. CERTIFICATE APPLICATION AND ISSUANCE. (a) A
13	physician who owns or operates a pain management clinic shall apply
14	for a certificate for the clinic under this chapter. A pain
15	management clinic must be owned and operated by a medical director
16	who is a physician who practices in this state under an unrestricted
17	license.
18	(b) An applicant for a certificate under this chapter must
19	submit an application to the board on a form prescribed by the
20	board.
21	(c) The board shall issue a certificate if the board finds
22	that the pain management clinic meets the requirements of this
23	chapter and the standards adopted by the board under this chapter.
24	[Sections 167.103-167.150 reserved for expansion]
25	SUBCHAPTER D. CERTIFICATE RENEWAL
26	Sec. 167.151. EXPIRATION OF CERTIFICATE. (a) A
27	certificate issued under this chapter expires on the second

No. 911 anniversary of the date it is issued. 1 2 (b) The board shall grant a 180-day grace period from the 3 expiration date of a certificate to renew the certificate. (c) The owner or operator of a pain management clinic for 4 which a certificate has expired may not continue to operate the 5 clinic until the clinic's certificate is renewed. 6 7 Sec. 167.152. REQUIREMENTS FOR RENEWAL. (a) The owner or operator of a pain management clinic may apply to renew a 8 9 certificate issued to the clinic under this chapter by: 10 (1) submitting a renewal application to the board on 11 the form prescribed by the board before the expiration of the grace 12 period under Section 167.151; and 13 (2) complying with any other requirements adopted by 14 board rule. 15 (b) If a certificate is not renewed before the expiration of 16 the grace period under Section 167.151, the pain management clinic must reapply for an original certificate to operate the clinic. 17 18 [Sections 167.153-167.200 reserved for expansion] SUBCHAPTER E. REGULATION OF CLINICS; ENFORCEMENT 19 Sec. 167.201. REGULATION OF PERSON AFFILIATED WITH CLINIC. 20 (a) The owner or operator of a pain management clinic, an employee 21 of the clinic, or a person with whom a clinic contracts for services 22 23 may not: (1) have been denied, by any jurisdiction, a license 24 25 under which the person may prescribe, dispense, administer, supply, 26 or sell a controlled substance; 27 (2) have held a license issued by any jurisdiction,

S.B. No. 911 under which the person may prescribe, dispense, administer, supply, 1 2 or sell a controlled substance, that has been restricted; or 3 (3) have been subject to disciplinary action by any 4 licensing entity for conduct that was a result of inappropriately prescribing, dispensing, administering, supplying, or selling a 5 controlled substance. 6 7 (b) A pain management clinic may not be owned wholly or partly by a person who has been convicted of, pled nolo contendere 8 9 to, or received deferred adjudication for: 10 (1) an offense that constitutes a felony; or 11 (2) an offense that constitutes a misdemeanor, the facts of which relate to the distribution of illegal prescription 12 13 drugs or a controlled substance as defined by Section 551.003(11). (c) The owner or operator of a pain management clinic shall: 14 15 (1) be on-site at the clinic at least 33 percent of the 16 clinic's total number of operating hours; and 17 (2) review at least 33 percent of the total number of patient files of the clinic, including the patient files of a clinic 18 employee or contractor to whom authority for patient care has been 19 20 delegated by the clinic. Sec. 167.202. DISCIPLINARY ACTION. (a) A violation of 21 this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter is grounds for 22 disciplinary action against a pain management clinic certified 23 under this chapter or an owner or operator of a clinic certified 24 25 under this chapter. (b) A violation of this chapter may be enforced in the same 26 27 manner as any other violation of this subtitle.

SECTION 2. (a) Not later than March 1, 2010, the Texas
 Medical Board shall adopt the rules required by Chapter 167,
 Occupations Code, as added by this Act.

4 (b) Notwithstanding Section 167.101, Occupations Code, as
5 added by this Act, a pain management clinic must obtain a
6 certificate required by that section not later than September 1,
7 2010.

8 SECTION 3. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of 9 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

10 (b) Section 167.101, Occupations Code, as added by this Act,11 takes effect September 1, 2010.
