6 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 7 to a claim for extended unemployment compensation benefits that is 8 filed with the Texas Workforce Commission on or after the effective 9 date of this Act. A claim filed before that date is governed by the 10 law in effect on the date that the claim was filed, and the former 11 law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
