- 2 relating to access to certain confidential patient information
- 3 within the Department of State Health Services.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subdivision (7), Section 108.002, Health and
- 6 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (7) "Department" means the [Texas] Department of State
- 8 Health Services.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 108, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 10 by adding Section 108.0026 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 108.0026. TRANSFER OF DUTIES; REFERENCE TO COUNCIL.
- 12 (a) The powers and duties of the Texas Health Care Information
- 13 Council under this chapter were transferred to the Department of
- 14 State Health Services in accordance with Section 1.19, Chapter 198
- 15 (H.B. 2292), Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003.
- 16 (b) In this chapter, a reference to the Texas Health Care
- 17 Information Council means the Department of State Health Services.
- 18 SECTION 3. Subsection (h), Section 108.009, Health and
- 19 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 20 (h) The department [council] shall coordinate data
- 21 collection with the data submission formats used by hospitals and
- 22 other providers. The <u>department</u> [council] shall accept data in the
- 23 format developed by the American National Standards Institute
- 24 [National Uniform Billing Committee (Uniform Hospital Billing Form

- 1 UB 92) and HCFA-1500] or its successor [their successors] or other
- 2 <u>nationally</u> [universally] accepted standardized forms that
- 3 hospitals and other providers use for other complementary purposes.
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 108.013, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), (d), (g), (i), and
- 6 (j) and adding Subsections (k), (l), (m), and (n) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (a) The data received by the department under this chapter
- 9 [council] shall be used by the department [council] for the benefit
- 10 of the public. Subject to specific limitations established by this
- 11 chapter and executive commissioner [council] rule, the department
- 12 [council] shall make determinations on requests for information in
- 13 favor of access.
- 14 (b) The executive commissioner [council] by rule shall
- 15 designate the characters to be used as uniform patient identifiers.
- 16 The basis for assignment of the characters and the manner in which
- 17 the characters are assigned are confidential.
- 18 (c) Unless specifically authorized by this chapter, the
- 19 department [council] may not release and a person or entity may not
- 20 gain access to any data obtained under this chapter:
- 21 (1) that could reasonably be expected to reveal the
- 22 identity of a patient;
- 23 (2) that could reasonably be expected to reveal the
- 24 identity of a physician;
- 25 (3) disclosing provider discounts or differentials
- 26 between payments and billed charges;
- 27 (4) relating to actual payments to an identified

- 1 provider made by a payer; or
- 2 (5) submitted to the <u>department</u> under this chapter
- 3 [council] in a uniform submission format that is not included in the
- 4 public use data set established under Sections 108.006(f) and (g),
- 5 except in accordance with Section 108.0135.
- 6 (d) Except as provided by this section, all [All] data
- 7 collected and used by the department [and the council] under this
- 8 chapter is subject to the confidentiality provisions and criminal
- 9 penalties of:
- 10 (1) Section 311.037;
- 11 (2) Section 81.103; and
- 12 (3) Section 159.002, Occupations Code.
- 13 (g) Unless specifically authorized by this chapter, the
- 14 department [The council] may not release data elements in a manner
- 15 that will reveal the identity of a patient. The department
- 16 [council] may not release data elements in a manner that will reveal
- 17 the identity of a physician.
- 18 (i) Notwithstanding any other law, the [council and the]
- 19 department may not provide information made confidential by this
- 20 section to any other agency of this state.
- 21 (j) The executive commissioner [council] shall by rule [τ
- 22 with the assistance of the advisory committee under Section
- 23 $\frac{108.003(g)(5)_{7}}{}$] develop and implement a mechanism to comply with
- 24 Subsections (c)(1) and (2).
- 25 (k) The department may disclose data collected under this
- 26 chapter that is not included in public use data to any program
- 27 within the department if the disclosure is reviewed and approved by

- 1 the institutional review board under Section 108.0135.
- 2 (1) Confidential data collected under this chapter that is
- 3 disclosed to a program within the department remains subject to the
- 4 confidentiality provisions of this chapter and other applicable
- 5 law. The department shall identify the confidential data that is
- 6 disclosed to a program under Subsection (k). The program shall
- 7 maintain the confidentiality of the disclosed confidential data.
- 8 (m) The following provisions do not apply to the disclosure
- 9 of data to a department program:
- 10 (1) Section 81.103;
- 11 (2) Sections 108.010(g) and (h);
- 12 (3) Sections 108.011(e) and (f);
- 13 (4) Section 311.037; and
- 14 (5) Section 159.002, Occupations Code.
- 15 (n) Nothing in this section authorizes the disclosure of
- 16 physician identifying data.
- 17 SECTION 5. Section 108.0135, Health and Safety Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 108.0135. INSTITUTIONAL [SCIENTIFIC] REVIEW BOARD
- 20 [PANEL]. (a) The <u>department</u> [council] shall establish <u>an</u>
- 21 <u>institutional</u> [a scientific] review board [panel] to review and
- 22 approve requests for access to data not contained in [information
- 23 other than] public use data. The members of the institutional
- 24 <u>review board must</u> [panel shall] have experience and expertise in
- 25 ethics, patient confidentiality, and health care data.
- 26 (b) To assist the institutional review board [panel] in
- 27 determining whether to approve a request for information, the

- 1 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission
- 2 [council] shall adopt rules similar to the federal Centers for
- 3 Medicare and Medicaid Services' [Health Care Financing
- 4 Administration's guidelines on releasing data.
- 5 (c) A request for information other than public use data
- 6 must be made on the form prescribed [created] by the department
- 7 [council].
- 8 (d) Any approval to release information under this section
- 9 must require that the confidentiality provisions of this chapter be
- 10 maintained and that any subsequent use of the information conform
- 11 to the confidentiality provisions of this chapter.
- 12 SECTION 6. Subdivision (5), Section 108.002, Health and
- 13 Safety Code, is repealed.
- 14 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
