## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the authority for certain high school students to serve
3	as election clerks.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subsection (c), Section 32.051, Election Code,
6	is amended to read as follows:
7	(c) Except as provided by Section 32.0511, to $[To]$ be
8	eligible to serve as a clerk of an election precinct, a person must
9	be a qualified voter:
10	(1) of the county, in a countywide election ordered by
11	the governor or a county authority or in a primary election;
12	(2) of the part of the county in which the election is
13	held, for an election ordered by the governor or a county authority
14	that does not cover the entire county of the person's residence; or
15	(3) of the political subdivision, in an election
16	ordered by an authority of a political subdivision other than a
17	county.
18	SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 32, Election Code, is
19	amended by adding Section 32.0511 to read as follows:
20	Sec. 32.0511. SPECIAL ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: STUDENT
21	ELECTION CLERKS. (a) In this section:
22	(1) "Educational institution" means:
23	(A) a public secondary school; or
24	(B) an accredited private or parochial secondary

1	school.
2	(2) "Student" means a person enrolled in an
3	educational institution or a home-schooled student.
4	(b) A student who is ineligible to serve as a clerk of an
5	election precinct under Section 32.051(c) is eligible to serve as a
6	clerk of an election precinct under this section if the student:
7	(1) at the time of appointment as an election clerk:
8	(A) is a student at an educational institution or
9	attends a home school that meets the requirements of Section
10	25.086(a)(1), Education Code; and
11	(B) has the consent of:
12	(i) the principal of the educational
13	institution attended by the student; or
14	(ii) in the case of a home-schooled
15	student, a parent or legal guardian who is responsible for the
16	student's education; and
17	(2) at the time of service as an election clerk:
18	(A) is 16 years of age or older;
19	(B) is a United States citizen; and
20	(C) has completed any training course required by
21	the entity holding the election.
22	(c) A student election clerk serving under this section:
23	(1) is entitled to compensation under Section 32.091
24	in the same manner as other election clerks; and
25	(2) when communicating with a voter who cannot
26	communicate in English, may communicate with the voter in a
27	language the voter and the clerk understand as authorized by

- 1 Subchapter B, Chapter 61.
- 2 (d) Not more than two student election clerks may serve at a
- 3 polling place, except that not more than four student election
- 4 clerks may serve at any countywide polling place.
- 5 (e) The secretary of state may initiate or assist in the
- 6 development of a statewide program promoting the use of student
- 7 election clerks appointed under this section.
- 8 SECTION 3. Subsection (b), Section 25.087, Education Code,
- 9 is amended to read as follows:
- 10 (b) A school district shall excuse a student from attending
- 11 school for:
- 12 (1) the following purposes, including travel for those
- 13 purposes:
- 14 (A) observing religious holy days; [or]
- 15 (B) attending a required court appearance; or
- (C) serving as an election clerk; or
- 17 (2) a temporary absence resulting from health care
- 18 professionals if that student commences classes or returns to
- 19 school on the same day of the appointment.
- SECTION 4. Subchapter D, Chapter 33, Education Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Section 33.092 to read as follows:
- Sec. 33.092. STUDENT ELECTION CLERKS. A student who is
- 23 appointed as a student election clerk under Section 32.0511,
- 24 Election Code, may apply the time served as a student election clerk
- 25 toward:
- 26 (1) a requirement for a school project at the
- 27 discretion of the teacher who assigned the project; or

- 1 (2) a service requirement for participation in an
- 2 <u>advanced academic course program at the discretion of the program</u>
- 3 sponsor or a school-sponsored extracurricular activity at the
- 4 <u>discretion of the school sponsor.</u>
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
