## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to student loan repayment assistance for speech-language
3	pathologists or audiologists employed by a public school or as
4	faculty members of certain programs at institutions of higher
5	education.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
8	Subchapter FF to read as follows:
9	SUBCHAPTER FF. REPAYMENT OF CERTAIN SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST
10	AND AUDIOLOGIST EDUCATION LOANS
11	Sec. 61.9801. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
12	(1) "Audiologist" means a person licensed as ar
13	audiologist under Chapter 401, Occupations Code.
14	(2) "Communicative disorders program" means:
15	(A) a graduate degree program in audiology or
16	speech-language pathology accredited by the Council on Academic
17	Accreditation in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology; or
18	(B) an undergraduate degree program that
19	prepares and qualifies a student to apply for admission to a
20	graduate degree program described by Paragraph (A).
21	(3) "Public school" means a public preschool or
22	primary or secondary school in this state.
23	(4) "Speech-language pathologist" means a persor
24	licensed as a speech-language pathologist under Chapter 401,

- 2 Sec. 61.9802. REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE AUTHORIZED. The board
- 3 shall provide, in accordance with this subchapter and board rules,
- 4 assistance in the repayment of student loans for speech-language
- 5 pathologists and audiologists who apply and qualify for assistance.
- 6 Sec. 61.9803. ELIGIBILITY. (a) To be eligible to receive
- 7 repayment assistance, a speech-language pathologist or an
- 8 <u>audiologist must:</u>
- 9 <u>(1) apply to the board; and</u>
- 10 (2) at the time the speech-language pathologist or
- 11 audiologist applies for the assistance:
- 12 (A) have been employed as a speech-language
- 13 pathologist or as an audiologist, as applicable, for at least one
- 14 year by, and be currently employed full-time in that capacity by, a
- 15 public school; or
- 16 (B) have been employed as a faculty member of a
- 17 communicative disorders program at an institution of higher
- 18 education or private or independent institution of higher education
- 19 for at least one year, and be currently employed full-time in that
- 20 capacity at such an institution.
- 21 (b) The board by rule may provide for repayment assistance
- 22 <u>on a pro rata basis for speech-language pathologists and</u>
- 23 audiologists employed part-time by a public school or by an
- 24 institution of higher education or private or independent
- 25 institution of higher education.
- Sec. 61.9804. LIMITATION. (a) On qualifying for the
- 27 assistance, a speech-language pathologist or an audiologist may

- 1 receive repayment assistance grants for each year of employment,
- 2 not to exceed five years, by:
- 3 (1) a public school; or
- 4 (2) a communicative disorders program at an
- 5 <u>institution</u> of higher education or private or independent
- 6 institution of higher education.
- 7 (b) The total amount of repayment assistance grants
- 8 received by a speech-language pathologist or an audiologist under
- 9 this subchapter may not exceed, for each applicable year of
- 10 employment:
- 11 (1) for an eligible recipient who holds a master's
- 12 degree but not a doctoral degree, \$6,000; or
- 13 (2) for an eligible recipient who holds a doctoral
- 14 degree, \$9,000.
- Sec. 61.9805. ELIGIBLE LOANS. (a) The board may provide
- 16 repayment assistance for the repayment of any student loan for
- 17 education at any public or private institution of higher education,
- 18 including loans for undergraduate education, received by a
- 19 speech-language pathologist or an audiologist through any lender.
- 20 (b) Each state fiscal biennium, the board shall attempt to
- 21 provide repayment assistance in amounts sufficient to use all the
- 22 money appropriated to the board for that biennium for the purpose of
- 23 providing repayment assistance under this subchapter.
- Sec. 61.9806. REPAYMENT. (a) After each year of
- 25 employment for which a speech-language pathologist or audiologist
- 26 is eligible to receive a repayment assistance grant under this
- 27 subchapter, the coordinating board shall deliver any repayment made

- 1 under this subchapter in a lump sum payable:
- 2 (1) to both the speech-language pathologist or
- 3 audiologist and the lender or other holder of the loan; or
- 4 (2) directly to the lender or other holder of the loan,
- 5 on behalf of the speech-language pathologist or audiologist.
- 6 (b) A repayment made under this subchapter may be applied to
- 7 both the principal amount of the loan and to interest on the loan.
- 8 <u>Sec. 61.9807. ADVISORY COMMITTEES. The board may appoint</u>
- 9 advisory committees to assist the board in administering this
- 10 subchapter.
- Sec. 61.9808. ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS. The board may accept
- 12 gifts, grants, and donations for the purposes of this subchapter.
- Sec. 61.9809. RULES. (a) The board shall adopt rules
- 14 necessary for the administration of this subchapter.
- 15 (b) The board shall distribute a copy of the rules adopted
- 16 under this section and pertinent information regarding this
- 17 subchapter to:
- 18 (1) each appropriate institution of higher education
- 19 or private or independent institution of higher education;
- 20 (2) any appropriate state agency; and
- 21 (3) any appropriate professional association.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act does not make an appropriation. A
- 23 provision in this Act that creates a new governmental program,
- 24 creates a new entitlement, or imposes a new duty on a governmental
- 25 entity is not mandatory during a fiscal period for which the
- 26 legislature has not made a specific appropriation to implement the
- 27 provision.
