A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to student loan repayment assistance for speech-language
3	pathologists or audiologists employed by a public school or as
4	faculty members of certain graduate programs at public institutions
5	of higher education.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
8	Subchapter FF to read as follows:
9	SUBCHAPTER FF. REPAYMENT OF CERTAIN SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST
10	AND AUDIOLOGIST EDUCATION LOANS
11	Sec. 61.9801. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
12	(1) "Audiologist" means a person licensed as ar
13	audiologist under Chapter 401, Occupations Code.
14	(2) "Communicative disorders program" means a
15	graduate degree program in audiology or speech-language pathology
16	accredited by the Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology
17	and Speech-Language Pathology.
18	(3) "Public school" means a public preschool or
19	primary or secondary school in this state.
20	(4) "Speech-language pathologist" means a persor
21	licensed as a speech-language pathologist under Chapter 401,
22	Occupations Code.
23	Sec. 61.9802. REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE AUTHORIZED. The board

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shall provide, in accordance with this subchapter and board rules,

- 1 assistance in the repayment of student loans for speech-language
- 2 pathologists and audiologists who apply and qualify for assistance.
- 3 Sec. 61.9803. ELIGIBILITY. (a) To be eligible to receive
- 4 repayment assistance, a speech-language pathologist or an
- 5 audiologist must:
- 6 (1) apply to the board; and
- 7 (2) at the time the speech-language pathologist or
- 8 audiologist applies for the assistance:
- 9 (A) have been employed as a speech-language
- 10 pathologist or as an audiologist, as applicable, for at least one
- 11 year by, and be currently employed full-time in that capacity by, a
- 12 public school; or
- 13 (B) have been employed as a faculty member of a
- 14 communicative disorders program at an institution of higher
- 15 education for at least one year, and be currently employed
- 16 <u>full-time</u> in that capacity at such an institution.
- 17 (b) The board by rule may provide for repayment assistance
- 18 on a pro rata basis for speech-language pathologists and
- 19 audiologists employed part-time by a public school or institution
- 20 of higher education.
- Sec. 61.9804. LIMITATION. (a) On qualifying for the
- 22 <u>assistance</u>, a speech-language pathologist or an audiologist may
- 23 receive repayment assistance grants for each year of employment,
- 24 not to exceed five years, by:
- 25 (1) a public school; or
- 26 (2) a communicative disorders program at an
- 27 institution of higher education.

- 1 (b) The amount of repayment assistance grants that a
- 2 speech-language pathologist or an audiologist may receive for each
- 3 year of employment by a public school or a communicative disorders
- 4 program at an institution of higher education may not exceed 20
- 5 percent of the speech-language pathologist's or audiologist's total
- 6 principal amount of student loans.
- 7 (c) The total amount of repayment assistance grants
- 8 received by a speech-language pathologist or an audiologist under
- 9 this subchapter may not exceed \$30,000 for an eligible recipient
- 10 who holds a master's degree but not a doctoral degree, or \$45,000
- 11 for an eligible recipient who holds a doctoral degree.
- Sec. 61.9805. ELIGIBLE LOANS. (a) The board may provide
- 13 repayment assistance for the repayment of any student loan for
- 14 education at an institution of higher education, including loans
- 15 for undergraduate education, received by a speech-language
- 16 pathologist or an audiologist through any lender.
- 17 (b) The board may not provide repayment assistance for a
- 18 student loan that is in default at the time of the speech-language
- 19 pathologist's or audiologist's application.
- 20 (c) Each state fiscal biennium, the board shall attempt to
- 21 provide repayment assistance in amounts sufficient to use all the
- 22 money appropriated to the board for that biennium for the purpose of
- 23 providing repayment assistance under this subchapter.
- Sec. 61.9806. REPAYMENT. (a) The board shall deliver any
- 25 repayment made under this subchapter in a lump sum payable to the
- 26 lender and the speech-language pathologist or audiologist, in
- 27 accordance with any applicable federal law.

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- 1 (b) A repayment made under this subchapter may be applied
- 2 only to the principal amount of the loan.
- 3 Sec. 61.9807. ADVISORY COMMITTEES. The board may appoint
- 4 advisory committees to assist the board in administering this
- 5 <u>subchapter.</u>
- 6 Sec. 61.9808. ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS. The board may accept
- 7 gifts, grants, and donations for the purposes of this subchapter.
- 8 Sec. 61.9809. RULES. (a) The board shall adopt rules
- 9 necessary for the administration of this subchapter.
- 10 (b) The board shall distribute a copy of the rules adopted
- 11 under this section and pertinent information regarding this
- 12 <u>subchapter to:</u>
- 13 (1) each institution of higher education;
- 14 (2) any appropriate state agency; and
- 15 (3) any appropriate professional association.
- 16 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
