The department shall conduct a study of: 8 9 (1) technologies such as statistical techniques, devices, or models that may be used by or on behalf of an insurer 10 11 that writes personal automobile or residential property insurance 12 to establish new classifications or to change methods of classification for rating, tiering, or underwriting; and 13 14 (2) the manner in which the insurer may use the relationships derived from the technologies described 15 by Subdivision (1) in: 16 predicting differences in expected losses of 17 (A) insureds or applicants for coverage; 18 underwriting and creating and defining risk 19 (B) 20 classifications or changing a method of classification; 21 (C) setting or determining rates and premiums; or 22 using classifications or a change in a method (D) 23 of classification to deny coverage, limit coverage, or refuse to renew or cancel coverage for individual insureds. 24

SECTION 3. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. 1 The department shall include a report of the results of the study conducted under this 2 Act in the biennial report to the 82nd Legislature made under 3 Section 32.022, Insurance Code. The report must describe the impact 4 5 that the use of the relationships derived from technologies 6 described by Section 2 of this Act has on insurance, insureds, and for insurance in this state, and may 7 applicants include 8 recommendations for proposed legislation appropriate to regulate 9 or mitigate the use of those technologies.

10 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 11 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 12 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 13 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 14 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
