## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to a parenting and paternity awareness component of the

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 28.002(p), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (p) The State Board of Education, in conjunction with the
- 8 office of the attorney general, shall develop a parenting and
- 9 paternity awareness program for [that a school district shall] use
- 10 in a school [the] district's high school health curriculum. The
- 11 program shall be included in the curriculum for any full-year high
- 12 school course that meets a requirement for health education credit.
- 13 At the discretion of a district, the program or part of the program
- 14 may be included in the curriculum for a high school course lasting
- 15 less than a full year that meets a requirement for health education
- 16 credit. The program must:
- 17 (1) address parenting skills and responsibilities,
- 18 including child support and other legal rights and responsibilities
- 19 that come with parenthood;
- 20 (2) address relationship skills, including money
- 21 management, communication skills, and marriage preparation; and
- 22 (3) in district high schools that do not have a family
- 23 violence prevention program, address skills relating to the
- 24 prevention of family violence.

- 1 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010
- 2 school year.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
