2	relating to the regulation of heir finders by the Texas Private
3	Security Board; providing penalties.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1702.002, Occupations Code, is amended
6	by adding Subdivisions (6-b) and (8-a) to read as follows:
7	(6-b) "Estate," "heir," and "probate court" have the
8	meanings assigned by Section 3, Texas Probate Code.
9	(8-a) "Heir finder" means a person who for payment of a
10	fee, assignment of a portion of any interest in a decedent's estate,
11	or other consideration provides information, assistance, forensic
12	genealogy research, or other efforts related to another person's
13	right to or interest in a decedent's estate.
14	SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 1702.004, Occupations
15	Code, is amended to read as follows:
16	(a) The board, in addition to performing duties required by
17	other law or exercising powers granted by other law:
18	(1) licenses investigations companies and security
19	services contractors;

- (2) issues commissions to certain security officers;
- 21 (3) issues authorizations to certain security
- officers engaged in the personal protection of individuals; 22
- (4) 23 registers:

(A) certain individuals connected with a license 24

- 1 holder; and
- 2 (B) certain individuals employed in a field
- 3 connected to private investigation or private security; [and]
- 4 (5) licenses heir finders under Subchapter K-1; and
- $\underline{\text{(6)}}$ regulates license holders, security officers, and
- 6 registrants under this chapter.
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 1702.042, Occupations Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1702.042. PERSONNEL; CONFLICT OF INTEREST. An
- 10 employee of the commission may not:
- 11 (1) have a financial or business interest, contingent
- 12 or otherwise, in a security services contractor, [or]
- 13 investigations company, or company providing services as an heir
- 14 finder; or
- 15 (2) be licensed under this chapter.
- SECTION 4. Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 17 adding Subchapter K-1 to read as follows:
- 18 SUBCHAPTER K-1. REGULATION OF HEIR FINDERS
- Sec. 1702.271. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "family
- 20 member," with respect to a decedent, means a person who would be
- 21 considered an heir of the decedent at the time of the decedent's
- 22 <u>death.</u>
- Sec. 1702.272. APPLICATION OF SUBCHAPTER. (a) This
- 24 <u>subchapter does not apply to:</u>
- (1) a person acting in the capacity of a personal
- 26 representative, attorney ad litem, guardian ad litem, or other
- 27 person appointed by a probate court in which a proceeding in

- 1 connection with a decedent's estate is pending;
- 2 (2) a forensic genealogist employed or retained by a
- 3 government agency, court, or court-appointed attorney ad litem; or
- 4 (3) an attorney providing legal services to a
- 5 decedent's family member if the attorney has not agreed to pay to
- 6 any other person a portion of the fees received from the family
- 7 member or the family member's interest in the decedent's estate.
- 8 (b) In this section, "attorney ad litem," "guardian ad
- 9 litem," and "personal representative" have the meanings assigned by
- 10 the Texas Probate Code.
- Sec. 1702.273. LICENSE REQUIRED. (a) A person may not
- 12 offer to provide or provide services as an heir finder unless the
- 13 person holds a license as an heir finder.
- 14 (b) A <u>license under this subchapter:</u>
- 15 (1) is valid for three years from the date of issuance;
- 16 and
- 17 (2) may be renewed.
- 18 Sec. 1702.274. LICENSE APPLICATION. An application for a
- 19 license under this subchapter must be in the form prescribed by the
- 20 board and include:
- 21 (1) the full name and business address of the
- 22 applicant;
- 23 (2) the name under which the applicant intends to do
- 24 <u>business;</u>
- 25 (3) a statement as to the general nature of the
- 26 business in which the applicant intends to engage;
- 27 (4) if the applicant is an entity other than an

- 1 individual, the full name and residence address of each partner,
- 2 officer, and director of the applicant, and of the applicant's
- 3 manager;
- 4 (5) if the applicant is an individual, two
- 5 classifiable sets of fingerprints of the applicant or, if the
- 6 applicant is an entity other than an individual, of each officer and
- 7 of each partner or shareholder who owns at least a 25 percent
- 8 interest in the applicant;
- 9 (6) a verified statement of the applicant's experience
- 10 and qualifications;
- 11 (7) a report from the department stating the
- 12 applicant's record of any convictions for a Class B misdemeanor or
- 13 equivalent offense or a greater offense;
- 14 (8) the social security number of the individual
- 15 making the application; and
- 16 (9) other information, evidence, statements, or
- 17 <u>documents required by the board.</u>
- Sec. 1702.275. FEES. The board may adopt fees as necessary
- 19 for the issuance of a license under this subchapter.
- Sec. 1702.276. INSURANCE; BOND. A license holder shall
- 21 maintain on file with the board at all times a surety bond and
- 22 <u>certificate of insurance as required by board rule. The insurance</u>
- 23 policy must contain minimum limits of \$2 million for all
- 24 <u>occurrences</u>.
- Sec. 1702.277. CERTAIN CONTRACTS. (a) This section
- 26 applies only to a contract or other agreement that:
- 27 (1) is entered into with a family member of a decedent

- 1 or with another person on behalf of the family member; and
- 2 (2) provides for payment of a fee, assignment of a
- 3 portion of any interest in the decedent's estate, or other
- 4 consideration by the family member out of the family member's right
- 5 to or interest in the decedent's estate to a person licensed under
- 6 this subchapter for providing information, assistance, forensic
- 7 genealogy research, or other efforts related to the family member's
- 8 right to or interest in the decedent's estate or property.
- 9 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), if the amount or
- 10 value of the fee, assignment, or other consideration for a contract
- 11 or other agreement described by Subsection (a) is equal to or less
- 12 than 30 percent of the value of the family member's right to or
- 13 interest in the decedent's estate, a person licensed under this
- 14 subchapter may enter into the contract or agreement only at the
- 15 discretion of the probate court in which the proceeding in
- 16 connection with the decedent's estate is pending.
- (c) A person licensed under this subchapter may not enter
- 18 into a contract or other agreement described by Subsection (a):
- 19 (1) subject to Subsection (d), during the 75-day
- 20 period after the earlier of:
- 21 (A) the date of the filing of an application for
- 22 determination of heirship of the decedent; or
- (B) the date of the filing of a pleading to
- 24 determine which family members of the decedent have a right to
- 25 property in the decedent's estate, if the right to the property is
- 26 based principally on the probate court's determination of the
- 27 decedent's family history; or

- 1 (2) if the amount or value of the fee, assignment, or
- 2 other consideration is greater than 30 percent of the value of the
- 3 family member's right to or interest in the decedent's estate.
- 4 (d) Subsection (c)(1) applies only if a forensic
- 5 genealogist or attorney ad litem has been appointed by a probate
- 6 court in which a proceeding in connection with the decedent's
- 7 <u>estate is pending.</u>
- 8 (e) A contract entered into in violation of this section is
- 9 void.
- 10 Sec. 1702.278. COMPLAINTS AND DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS. A
- 11 person licensed under this subchapter is subject to the same
- 12 complaint procedures and disciplinary actions as other persons
- 13 regulated under this chapter.
- Sec. 1702.279. PENALTIES. A person licensed under this
- 15 subchapter is subject to the same penalties and enforcement
- 16 procedures as other persons regulated under this chapter.
- Sec. 1702.280. FIDUCIARY DUTY; LIABILITY. (a) A person
- 18 licensed under this subchapter who provides services as an heir
- 19 finder to another person owes a fiduciary duty to the other person
- 20 to act in that person's best interest.
- 21 (b) A person who breaches a fiduciary duty under Subsection
- 22 (a) is liable for any damages resulting from the breach, including:
- 23 (1) any loss or depreciation in value of the estate as
- 24 a result of the breach;
- 25 (2) any profit made by the person as a result of the
- 26 breach;
- 27 (3) any profit that would have accrued to the estate if

- 1 there had been no breach;
- 2 (4) exemplary damages; and
- 3 (5) costs and attorney's fees incurred as a result of
- 4 the breach.
- 5 SECTION 5. Chapter I, Texas Probate Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Section 36G to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 36G. HEIR FINDERS. (a) In this section, "heir
- 8 finder" has the meaning assigned by Section 1702.002, Occupations
- 9 Code.
- 10 (b) The court may not appoint an attorney as an attorney ad
- 11 <u>litem in a probate proceeding if the attorney:</u>
- 12 (1) is acting as or represents an heir finder in the
- 13 same proceeding; or
- 14 (2) has acted as or has represented an heir finder in
- 15 another probate proceeding concerning the same decedent.
- (c) Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, governs the licensing
- 17 and regulation of heir finders.
- SECTION 6. Section 36G, Texas Probate Code, as added by this
- 19 Act, applies only to a probate proceeding commenced on or after the
- 20 effective date of this Act without regard to whether:
- 21 (1) the decedent's death occurred before, on, or after
- 22 that date; or
- 23 (2) the probate proceeding is the original proceeding.
- 24 SECTION 7. As soon as possible after the effective date of
- 25 this Act, the Texas Private Security Board shall adopt the form,
- 26 procedures, and fees necessary to implement Subchapter K-1, Chapter
- 27 1702, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.

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- 1 SECTION 8. Notwithstanding Subchapter K-1, Chapter 1702,
- 2 Occupations Code, as added by this Act, a person offering to provide
- 3 or providing services as an heir finder is not required to be
- 4 licensed under that subchapter before January 1, 2010.
- 5 SECTION 9. Section 1702.277, Occupations Code, as added by
- 6 this Act, applies only to a contract entered into on or after
- 7 January 1, 2010.
- 8 SECTION 10. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of
- 9 this section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
- 10 (b) Sections 1702.273, 1702.277, 1702.278, 1702.279, and
- 11 1702.280, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, take effect
- 12 January 1, 2010.
