1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of heir finders by the Texas Private
3	Security Board.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1702.002, Occupations Code, is amended
6	by adding Subdivisions (6-b) and (8-a) to read as follows:
7	(6-b) "Estate," "heir," and "probate court" have the
8	meanings assigned by Section 3, Texas Probate Code.
9	(8-a) "Heir finder" means a person who for payment of a
10	fee, assignment of a portion of any interest in a decedent's estate,
11	or other consideration provides information, assistance, forensic
12	genealogy research, or other efforts related to another person's
13	right to or interest in a decedent's estate.
14	SECTION 2. Section 1702.004(a), Occupations Code, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	(a) The board, in addition to performing duties required by
17	other law or exercising powers granted by other law:
18	(1) licenses investigations companies and security
19	services contractors;
20	(2) issues commissions to certain security officers;
21	(3) issues authorizations to certain security
22	officers engaged in the personal protection of individuals;
23	(4) registers:
24	(A) certain individuals connected with a license

S.B. No. 1243 1 holder; and 2 (B) certain individuals employed in a field 3 connected to private investigation or private security; [and] 4 (5) registers heir finders under Subchapter K-1; and 5 (6) regulates license holders, security officers, and registrants under this chapter. 6 SECTION 3. Section 1702.042, Occupations Code, is amended 7 8 to read as follows: Sec. 1702.042. PERSONNEL; 9 CONFLICT OF INTEREST. An 10 employee of the commission may not: (1) have a financial or business interest, contingent 11 12 or otherwise, in a security services contractor, [or] investigations company, or company providing services as an heir 13 14 finder; or 15 (2) be licensed under this chapter. 16 SECTION 4. Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is amended by 17 adding Subchapter K-1 to read as follows: SUBCHAPTER K-1. REGULATION OF HEIR FINDERS 18 Sec. 1702.271. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "family 19 member," with respect to a decedent, means a person who would be 20 considered an heir of the decedent at the time of the decedent's 21 22 death. 23 Sec. 1702.272. APPLICATION OF SUBCHAPTER. (a) This 24 subchapter does not apply to: 25 (1) a person acting in the capacity of a personal 26 representative, attorney ad litem, guardian ad litem, or other person appointed by a probate court in which a proceeding in 27

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1	connection with a decedent's estate is pending; or
2	(2) an attorney providing legal services to a
3	decedent's family member if the attorney has not agreed to pay to
4	any other person a portion of the fees received from the family
5	member or the family member's interest in the decedent's estate.
6	(b) In this section, "attorney ad litem," "guardian ad
7	litem," and "personal representative" have the meanings assigned by
8	the Texas Probate Code.
9	Sec. 1702.273. REGISTRATION REQUIRED. (a) A person may not
10	offer to provide or provide services as an heir finder unless the
11	person registers with the board.
12	(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, an
13	heir finder is not required to be licensed or affiliated with a
14	license holder.
15	(c) A registration under this subchapter does not expire.
16	Sec. 1702.274. REGISTRATION APPLICATION. An application
17	for registration under this subchapter must be in the form
18	prescribed by the board and include:
19	(1) the full name and business address of the
20	applicant;
21	(2) the name under which the applicant intends to do
22	business;
23	(3) a statement as to the general nature of the
24	business in which the applicant intends to engage;
25	(4) if the applicant is an entity other than an
26	individual, the full name and residence address of each partner,
27	officer, and director of the applicant, and of the applicant's

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1	manager;
2	(5) if the applicant is an individual, two
3	classifiable sets of fingerprints of the applicant or, if the
4	applicant is an entity other than an individual, of each officer and
5	of each partner or shareholder who owns at least a 25 percent
6	interest in the applicant;
7	(6) a verified statement of the applicant's experience
8	and qualifications;
9	(7) a report from the department stating the
10	applicant's record of any convictions for a Class B misdemeanor or
11	equivalent offense or a greater offense;
12	(8) the social security number of the individual
13	making the application; and
14	(9) other information, evidence, statements, or
15	documents required by the board.
16	Sec. 1702.275. FEES. The board may adopt fees as necessary
17	for the registration of heir finders under this subchapter.
18	Sec. 1702.276. PROHIBITED CONTRACTS. (a) This section
19	applies only to a contract or other agreement that:
20	(1) is entered into with a family member of a decedent
21	or with another person on behalf of the family member; and
22	(2) provides for payment of a fee, assignment of a
23	portion of any interest in the decedent's estate, or other
24	consideration by the family member out of the family member's right
25	to or interest in the decedent's estate or to a person registered
26	under this subchapter for providing information, assistance,
27	forensic genealogy research, or other efforts related to the family

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1	member's right to or interest in the decedent's estate or property.
2	(b) A person registered under this subchapter may not enter
3	into a contract or other agreement described by Subsection (a):
4	(1) during the six-month period after the earlier of:
5	(A) the date of the filing of an application for
6	determination of heirship of the decedent; or
7	(B) the date of the filing of a pleading to
8	determine which family members of the decedent have a right to
9	property in the decedent's estate, if the right to the property is
10	based principally on the probate court's determination of the
11	decedent's family history; or
12	(2) if the amount or value of the fee, assignment, or
13	other consideration is greater than 10 percent of the value of the
14	family member's right to or interest in the decedent's estate.
15	(c) A contract entered into in violation of this section is
16	void.
17	Sec. 1702.277. COMPLAINTS AND DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS. A
18	person registered under this subchapter is subject to the same
19	complaint procedures and disciplinary actions as other persons
20	regulated under this chapter.
21	Sec. 1702.278. PENALTIES. A person registered under this
22	subchapter is subject to the same penalties and enforcement
23	procedures as other persons regulated under this chapter.
24	Sec. 1702.279. FIDUCIARY DUTY; LIABILITY. (a) A person
25	registered under this subchapter who provides services as an heir
26	finder to another person owes a fiduciary duty to the other person
27	to act in that person's best interest.

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1	(b) A person who breaches a fiduciary duty under Subsection
2	(a) is liable for any damages resulting from the breach, including:
3	(1) any loss or depreciation in value of the estate as
4	a result of the breach;
5	(2) any profit made by the person as a result of the
6	breach;
7	(3) any profit that would have accrued to the estate if
8	there had been no breach;
9	(4) exemplary damages; and
10	(5) costs and attorney's fees incurred as a result of
11	the breach.
12	SECTION 5. As soon as possible after the effective date of
13	this Act, the Texas Private Security Board shall adopt the form,
14	procedures, and fees necessary to implement Subchapter K-1, Chapter
15	1702, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
16	SECTION 6. Notwithstanding Subchapter K-1, Chapter 1702,
17	Occupations Code, as added by this Act, a person offering to provide
18	or providing services as an heir finder is not required to register
19	under that subchapter before January 1, 2010.
20	SECTION 7. Section 1702.276, Occupations Code, as added by
21	this Act, applies only to a contract entered into on or after
22	January 1, 2010.
23	SECTION 8. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
24	section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
25	(b) Sections 1702.273, 1702.276, 1702.277, 1702.278, and
26	1702.279, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, take effect
27	January 1, 2010.
