15	purposes of this subsection, a material fact includes whether the
16	person has an existing prescription for a controlled substance
17	issued for the same period of time by another practitioner.
18	(d-1) An offense under Subsection (a-1) is:
19	(1) a felony of the second degree if any controlled
20	substance that is the subject of the offense is listed in Schedule I
21	<u>or II;</u>
22	(2) a felony of the third degree if any controlled
23	substance that is the subject of the offense is listed in Schedule
24	III or IV; and

1	(3) a Class A misdemeanor if any controlled substance
2	that is the subject of the offense is listed in Schedule V.
3	SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only

4 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 5 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 6 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the 7 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of 8 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of 9 this Act if any element of the offense was committed before that 10 date.
